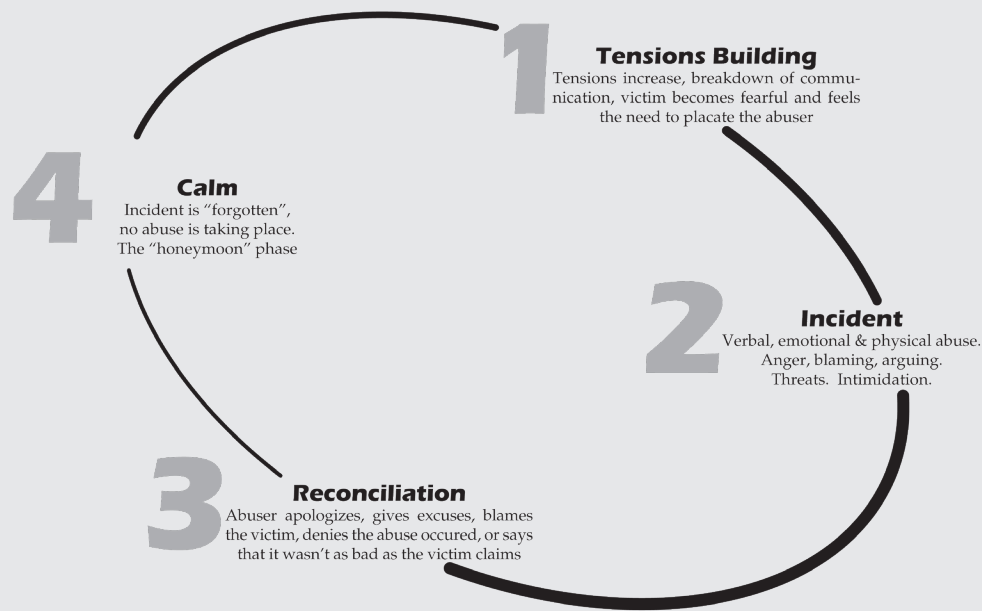

On Long Island, **35 percent of households earn less than the cost of living.**

"Poverty Amid Plenty on Long Island: A Truth Commission"

With an Area Median Income of \$110,800, Long Island is one of America's ten wealthiest suburbs. Yet a direct-service agency like

yours, and sadly, too many of our neighbors, live this reality reported by the US Census Bureau: *poverty is growing at a faster rate in the suburbs than in the cities*. Amid our Long Island affluence, poor people are largely hidden.

This is why we invite you and people you serve to testify at a hearing, **"Poverty Amid Plenty on Long Island: A Truth Commission"**

Tuesday, September 12, 2017, 4:00PM-9:00PM in the parish hall of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Church, 1434 Straight Path, Wyandanch.

Supper will be provided gratis thanks to the Wantagh Memorial Congregational Church. The enclosed flyer has details.

Please circulate this email invitation and flyer.

This hearing is one of three in New York State that, along with truth commission hearings in other states, will lead up to next year's 50th anniversary commemoration of the 1968 Poor People's Campaign. You may have read recently in a front-page *New York Times* article that the Rev. William Barber has stepped down as head of North Carolina's NAACP to lead this "New Poor People's Campaign."

On September 12th, we invite you and at least one person your agency serves to speak for no more than five minutes each on these questions:

1. *What is your story*

What are you seeing and experiencing regarding poverty on Long Island?

2. *What systemic injustices contribute to poverty?*

What are the one or two main underlying causes of the Long Island poverty that you experience?

3. *What government responses do we need?*

What one or two public policy recommendations would you offer to address these systemic causes of poverty on Long Island?

Your Long Island testimony will be consolidated into a report and submitted to the New York State Labor Religion Coalition in advance of a statewide "New Poor People's Campaign" gathering on October 17-18 in Binghamton that will feature an address by the Rev. William Barber. The New York State report will then be forwarded to the national New Poor People's Campaign.
