The community sale runs on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, April 24, 25 and 26. You choose which days and hours you want to operate your sale on your own property.



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## Tard of the Month

#### Judging for April to be done the last week of March in Area C, Sections 8 and 11.

Members of the Lakewood Forest Garden Club judge yards at the end of the month for the following month's award based on these established guidelines. Areas to be judged are rotated using the subdivision sections as listed in the Lakewood Forest Directory.

Once a yard has received recognition, it is not eligible for further awards for two years. One first place winner each month will receive a \$60 gift certificate, and two honorable mention winners will each receive a \$35 gift certificate. Recognition of winners is published in the Lakewood Forest Civic Association's official newsletter, Civic News, and online by the Lakewood Forest Fund. Plants for All Seasons gift certificates are provided through contributions from the Lakewood Forest Civic Association, the Lakewood Forest Fund and Plants for All Seasons.

Overall landscape design should be compatible with the	
architecture of the house; e.g., no windows hidden by shrubs	S
color, balanced design, etc	
Grass: green, except in winter; mowed and edged; weed-free	
Beds: cleaned, edged and mulched	
Color contrast; e.g., well placed variegated or colored shrubs, use of flowers and bulbs

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## Gardening Hints From the Pro, Sherri



#### **April To-Do List**

#### In the Veggie Garden

It's time to plant beans, cantaloupe, corn, cucumber, eggplant, honey dew, okra, peppers, summer squash, tomatillo, watermelon, basil, catmint, chives, cilantro, dill, fennel, lemongrass, mint, nasturtium, oregano, parsley, rosemary, sage, and thyme. All of these can be planted from seed, or transplants purchased from the nursery.

#### In the Flowerbeds

It's time to plant your warm weather flowers that will last all summer. The nursery is exploding with colorful options for any area of your yard. Make sure you prepare your beds by adding compost and fertilizer before you plant! Check out the new Color Star fertilizer; it smells like roses! Your whole yard will smell like a rose garden when you're done!

#### In the Lawn

If you haven't fertilized yet, it's OK to do it now. Do not use a Weed & Feed product unless completely necessary! If you only have a few weeds in a dormant lawn, just use a good quality lawn food like MicroLife Hybrid or NitroPhos Superturf. Mow on a low setting one time and bag to remove some of the

thick winter thatch build-up. Make sure you adjust the height back to 3" for future mowing. Adjust sprinkler heads and make sure you are getting adequate coverage. Make sure sprinklers are set based on water needs. If it's been raining, then turn the sprinklers off and then back on when it dries out. Water (either too much or not enough) is the biggest problem in St. Augustine lawns. Let your lawn tell you when it's thirsty. At the first sign of wilt, give it a drink. This will promote a deeper root system, and less fungal and weed infestations. To save on water over the next few months, apply MicroLife Humates Plus. Humates aid in water penetration and water absorption. Your lawn will thank you for it.

#### **Trees and Shrubs**

Do any necessary trimming and pruning if you haven't already and feed everything with a good slow release plant food like MicroLife (pink label).

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
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
