

Dear Friends in Christ,

It hasn't happened in over 50 years, but this year, in 2018, Easter Sunday falls on April 1. April Fool's Day. And I think that's very fitting.

Jesus' ministry was very threatening to those who were in power, both the Jewish religious authorities and the Roman authorities. The Jewish religious authorities, the Pharisees and scribes, loved to show that they were better than the everyday Jews because they were better able to follow God's laws in the Jewish scriptures (what is now our Old Testament). Jesus showed that the purpose of God's laws was not to show that someone is better and more religious than someone else. Rather, the purpose of God's laws was to show love and mercy to others, and especially to those who were struggling, like orphans, widows, and foreigners. Jesus' mission during his earthly ministry was to show us HOW to follow God's laws in a way that focused on the meaning of the law more than the letter. And the meaning of the law was to show God's love to the world.

But this meant that Jesus was showing the Jewish religious authorities that they were wrong. They were not focusing on what God wanted them to focus on. And they didn't like being told that they were wrong. Jesus was a threat to their power in the Jewish religious community, and they wanted him gone.

The Romans also viewed Jesus as a threat. The Roman Empire was very powerful during Jesus' lifetime, and they kept their power by violently squashing any attempt at rebellion. They persecuted the minority groups, like the Jews, and they acted quickly to stop anyone who made an attempt at overthrowing their power. Jesus, however, was a king-- not a king like the Romans, but a king of Heaven and Earth, showing us the Kingdom of God. Nonetheless, the Romans heard that Jesus was claiming to be a king, and they felt that they had to put a stop to the Jesus movement by killing him in the most painful, and public, way possible-- hanging him on a cross, for everyone to watch his painful death.

And so, the Roman authorities and the Jewish religious authorities worked together to have Jesus killed on a cross. Because Jesus' life and ministry was a threat to anyone in power who sought to keep their power through the means of violence. Jesus' life and ministry was a threat to anyone who thought they were better than everyone else, and sought to shame those who were already struggling to get through life. So they ended Jesus' life and ministry by putting him to death.

But a few days later, God raised Jesus from the dead. Jesus was resurrected. The resurrection was God's great "Yes!" to Jesus' life and ministry, because Jesus showed us how God wants us to live.

We sometimes play pranks and jokes on April Fool's Day. And we can look at the Resurrection of Jesus as a giant, glorious April Fool's joke on those who were against him. "Okay, powers of evil, violence, shame, corruption, and death-- you thought you were going to win? Ha ha, April Fool's! God's love has overcome all of you, because Jesus Christ has risen from the dead!"

Chair ProTem Maureen Even called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Present at the meeting were Maureen Even, Mary Adams, Pastor Kristen, Christy Phillips, Wayne Schneider, Kaye Jones, Christa Leach and Sara Borland. Absent from the meeting was Barb Hayek.

Pastor led devotions with the daily reading from "Christ In Our Home". The Bible verse for the day was from Exodus 19:8.

Elect President and Vice President for the council—Wayne Schneider made a motion to elect Maureen Even as President. Sara Borland seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mary Adams made a motion to elect Wayne Schneider as Vice President. Christa Leach seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Secretary's Report**—Wayne Schneider made a motion to accept the Secretary's report. Christa Leach seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report**—Christa Leach made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Sara Borland seconded the motion. Motion carried. The balance in the checking account at the end of January is \$81.73.

The water made its way into the hallway and also into the kitchen under the island. Mary Adams cleaned up what she could and turned on the dehumidifier. The sump pump area has been cleaned out and the sump pump is now working. The new windows have been installed into the kitchen.

Scholarship—information regarding the scholarship has been placed in the Lamp and the weekly bulletin. Applications are due to Pat Winblade by March 1, 2018. Pat Winblade has agreed to be the chairperson of the Scholarship Committee. Sue Rigdon has agreed to be on the committee since Dawna Smith is no longer a member.

Worship & Music—hymns have been chosen till the end of April.

Youth—The Hoeys do know which hotel they will be staying in when going to the Youth Gathering in Austin, TX. A fundraiser is being held on Friday night February 16, 2018 to help with expenses.

### **Pastor's Report:**

In the past month, Pastor has had 3 home communion visits and has presided over 1 worship service at Buchanan County ABCM Rehab.

The Ministerium Week of Prayer for Christian Unity service on January 18 was fairly well attended, and people enjoyed participating in the Unity Choir.

Meals on Wheels had paused for a while, but the Ministerium pastors discussed it a bit and it has restarted again.

Pastor has been working with the UMC and First Presbyterian churches to plan the spring semester of JAM (Jesus and Many).

Pastor took an online Continuing Education class called "Building Pastoral Resiliency," which was very helpful in helping her to focus on her mission and purpose as a Pastor, as well as techniques for dealing with difficulties that pastors encounter.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2018, and there will be 6 mid-week services. Beginning on February 21, we'll use the Holden Evening Prayer service and hear Reader's Theater presentations of some of Jesus' parables and miracles. If you are interested in being a reader, please let Pastor know.

On Saturday, February 17 at 2 PM, Pastor will be doing a special baptism service for a family that plans to join our church but is unable to have their extended family come on Sunday. Kaye Jones will be attending as a representative of the congregation.

On February 18, the churches in the Jubilee Conference will be holding a Conference Assembly at Zion Lutheran in Waterloo. The assembly is from 2-4 PM and is open to all. The members of our Abundant Life committee will be attending as our congregation's voting members. They Synod's Generosity network and Youth Ministry network will be doing presentations about their resources.

Pastor will be taking a continuing education class through UNI about Women in Christianity, Judaism and Islam. The class starts on February 14 and the following 3 Wednesday mornings.

On Wednesday March 7, which is an early out day, Pastor will have a muffin baking day with some of the youth and children baking muffins for the Easter breakfast.

The Taste of EWALU event this year will be Sunday, March 25, from 11:30 AM to 7 PM. All is welcome to attend.

Pastor is requesting vacation for the week of April 2-8, which is the week right after Easter. Much of it will be a "stay-cation" to do spring cleaning in the house, and that Sunday will be the baptism of her new niece. This will be down in the St. Louis area. Mary Adams made a motion to accept the dates for Pastor's vacation. Kaye Jones seconded the motion. Motion carried. It was discussed to ask Tyler Hoey if he would like to do the service the morning of April 8.

### **New Business:**

Council placements with Committee's were discussed—Wayne Schneider would like to be the council representative on the Property Committee. Kaye Jones will be the council representative for the Be Our Guest. It was discussed to add Connie Jones to the Be Our Guest committee. Connie has been coming and helping out quite a bit with the meals. A question was asked regarding the Serving Groups, and the Serving Groups are only for funerals.

Maureen Even asked Wayne Schneider to be the head usher, Shirley Bergman to be the head organist and Chris and Mike Waring to be the financial secretary. They have all agreed to the positions. Christa Leach made a motion to accept them to their position. Kaye Jones seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Make a list of names to appoint 2 members to 2018 Nominating Committee—it was discussed to have each member of the council to come back to the March meeting with a name of a member who would be willing to serve on this committee in the fall.

Check with council members for the best day and time for the council meetings—it was discussed and decided this would be tabled until the March meeting when everyone could be there.

Council meal for incoming and outgoing council members—the dinner will be a potluck held on March 18, 2018 at 11:30 AM.

Use of church facilities—it was discussed to have one contact person for the congregation to contact, so we do not have to contact all council members before it is ok for members to use the church. It was discussed to form a committee to come up with guidelines for the use of the church facilities. Kaye Jones volunteered to be on the committee to redo the policy of using the church. Wayne Schneider made a motion for the Bergman Family to use the Fellowship Hall for Shirley's retirement party. Sara Borland seconded the motion. Motion carried. No fees will be charged as long as the party using the Fellowship Hall leaves it the way it was found.

Keys—Maureen Even sent an email to old council members on the list to see who still has keys. She has received keys back from BJ Collings for front door & kitchen door. It was discussed about another way of receiving packages at the church. Dawna Smith was receiving packages from Fed Ex & UPS for the church, then she would bring them to the church.

Kristi Clayton will be gone March 3-6. Maureen Even will fill in for her while she is gone that weekend.

Keith Neuhring made a suggestion from the Technology Committee to get a DVD player for the Fireside Room. This was discussed and Sara Borland will be checking on prices for a DVD player or Blu Ray/DVD combo and a smart TV to be used for Sunday school and confirmation classes.

It was discussed to set up a 5-year goal for a want and need list for improvements on the church. This will be discussed more at future meetings.
