



CURRENT STATUS OF THE LWRP & COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PROCESS

Tonight's public meeting presents the broad City-wide and neighborhood specific planning concepts developed to date during the Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) and Comprehensive Plan (CP) process. These concepts were refined based on feedback received during the first public information meeting on April 28, 2015, as well as input from the Community Advisory Committee (CAC). The goal of tonight's meeting is to assess interest in these concepts and refine them based on local knowledge and input from the Long Beach community. There is also the opportunity for the community to identify additional planning concepts that should be considered.

Following tonight's meeting, these planning concepts will be further developed and analyzed based on overall feasibility (e.g., funding, permitting regulations, required partnerships etc.), resiliency benefits and economic development potential. Some of the planning concepts may change or be eliminated based on this further analysis. This is a critical step in the LWRP and CP process, as it connects the City's vision for the future with actionable items for implementation. This step is also important in determining the phasing of projects and an overall timeline for implementation.
