

Montessori Educational Method	Traditional Educational Method
Emphasis is on cognitive, social, emotional and moral development	Emphasis is on cognitive and social development
Teacher prepares environment with specific materials and guides the children as they learn	Attention is focused on teacher instruction and presentation of materials
Emphasizes inner discipline	Teacher is primary enforcer of discipline
Mainly individual instruction to meet each child's individual needs	Mainly group instruction with some individual instruction
Mixed age grouping – promotes individual learning without pressure	Same age grouping – may encourage comparison and competition
Peer teaching and role modeling is a primary focus	Most teaching is done by the teacher
Curriculum is structured for each child	Curriculum is structured for the whole class
Child internalizes concepts through exploration of educational materials	Child is taught concepts by the teacher
Learning is self-paced, and the child usually continues with an activity for an extended time	Child is generally allotted a specific instructional time
Child determines own learning pace	Group determines learning pace
Child identifies own errors through observation	Teacher identifies errors
Multi sensory learning materials based on Dr. Maria Montessori's designs	Hands-on materials are typically toys
Classroom activities referred to as the "children's work"	Classroom activities referred to as "play"
Teacher gathers information about each child's developmental levels through careful observation and note taking and presents materials according to the needs of the child	Teacher plans age appropriate activities for the class and all participate at same level
