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## MINUTES OF THE HBPOA MEETING, COAST GUARD BUILDING September 12, 2019 @ 7:00 PM

The monthly meeting of the Hernando Beach Property Owners Association was called to order at 7:10 PM by Kathy Frase, President who led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance after having welcomed all in attendance. It should be noted that our meeting was preceded by a delicious ice cream social organized by our ever efficient and accommodating Hospitality Committee!

Kathy asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the June POA meeting as published in the September edition of the Beachcomber. Motion made by Cal Holland and seconded by Fran Baird passed.

Bud Frase apologized for having left the Treasurer's Report at home but assured the membership that all was in order and that the report would be made available at our next meeting. Having subsequently received a copy of this report, it can be here recorded: Balance on hand on 8/01/2019 was \$18,367.20 while the BOH as of 8/31/2019 was \$17,085.08. The report will be filed for audit.

Our president then explained the function/duties of the nominating committee which must be comprised of three non-board members. There are several important positions to be filled, notably that of president and vice-president since their terms are up at the end of this year. Both the treasurer and secretary are willing to stay on in their respective positions unless someone is willing to run to replace either. There are also two director positions that could be filled. Nancy Wachs, Diane Greenwell, and Jen Brown volunteered to serve on this committee. All members will be called by these ladies and given the opportunity to either volunteer themselves or place someone else's name in nomination. Next month this committee will present the slate of nominees. There will be ample opportunity for any other volunteers to come forward before the election is held at the Nov. meeting.

### REPORTS:

Landscaping.....Gladys Moore reported that there was yet another accident at the Triangle and provided details as to damage, cost, and

communication with the insurance company of the driver. Kathy Frase added that she, along with Mike Fulford, have been in communication with Scott Herring, Director of Public Works, with our concerns regarding the safety issues of the recurring accidents at the Triangle. One easily done intervention would be to install rumblestrips on the asphalt to make drivers more aware; however, several ideas are being explored that will take more time and money. The important thing is that this safety issue has caught the attention of people (including Jeff Rogers, Cty. Adm.) who, hopefully, will be in a position to help in a meaningful and effective way to help to reduce the number of accidents.

Publicity/Beachcomber.....Jen Brown advised us that the deadline for submissions for the next issue will be Monday, Sept 16, since our meeting this month was delayed a week.

Hospitality....LeeAnn Flood shared that we now have 201 members which includes 6 new members tonight: Donna Willis and William Wold, Ernest and Brenda Trumpold, and Scott and Kendra Fitzgerald. She gave an update on the Fall Festival, the date of which has been moved to Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> from 1 PM to 6 PM. Currently 14 tables have been purchased for artists/crafters to display and sell their wares. Due to County regulations, no food can be sold but there will be water and soft drinks available. All indicators point towards a fun filled afternoon for the whole

community with something for everyone! Lastly, LeeAnn reminded us that our Holiday Party will be held here at the Coast Guard Building on Dec. 7 from 6 to 9 PM. Meat will be provided by POA and the rest will be potluck. More information will be forthcoming. Finally the raffle was held for members present with prizes of a lovely basket and a painting donated by Diane Ziemski. Kathy used this opportunity to give appropriate accolades to our Hospitality Committee!

Port Authority.....Bennie Martinez reported that the PA took the summer off where meetings were concerned and will have their first Fall meeting next week, the 18<sup>th</sup>, here at the Coast Guard Building. Residents are strongly encouraged to attend any of these so important meetings. Steve Barton announced that the agenda and topics for discussion for the upcoming meeting are posted on Nextdoor.

Crime Watch...Joe Wachs, Pres., reminded us that their group meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 7 PM at the VFW and reiterated the purpose/function/opportunities and need for more involvement from interested community members. Joe recently attended the quarterly sheriff's meeting and will post details on Nextdoor. Joe then introduced the officers: Jesse Manno, VP, Carolyn Manno, Sec., and Kelly Reeve, Treas. The meeting for October will be on the second Tues to accommodate the sheriff's schedule. The monthly social/fundraiser will be a breakfast this month at the Silver Dolphin, the

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date to be announced.

GAC...John Paul Reeve began his presentation by having Kathy read a letter to be sent to the BOCC re the county budget. Fran Baird moved that we send the letter as written and Mike Fulford seconded the motion which passed; however, there were several points made post the vote. Chuck Greenwell pointed out that the BOCC needs to be asked to curtail any spending for which a return on the investment has not been demonstrated. Judy Zeller expressed her objection to the opening statement of the letter which stated that the POA (with a membership of 201 represented the entire community of 2000 residents), in her opinion, was misleading. After some discussion, Mike Fulford moved that the letter be accepted as previously stated with the addition of the two comments in the language proposed. Motion was seconded by Fran Baird and then passed. A copy of the amended letter will be kept with these minutes.

John Paul's second item was an update on the Sport Fishing Landing rezoning request which revealed all the delaying tactics that are being

perpetrated so that "business as usual" will continue indefinitely. Kathy acknowledged that it is all very complicated but reassured members present that the GAC is in constant communication with all involved parties and will keep the community informed as information becomes available, including public hearings. John Paul emphasized the importance of watchfulness on our part, to document violations if any are witnessed and of reporting the violation with documentation to the Code Enforcement. It is also so important that we attend in large numbers any public hearings regarding this issue and that our concern is expressed by letter/email to those who are in a position to make decisions on this issue when we are asked or if we simply feel compelled. It is our quality of life that is in jeopardy of being compromised. Kathy also promised that soon a timeline is going to be put together for the community so that everything that has occurred up to now is spelled out.

The last important issue that John Paul wanted to bring to our attention was that of an application for a special use exception by the S & T Boat Repair and Bait, LLC., on Shoal Line which has

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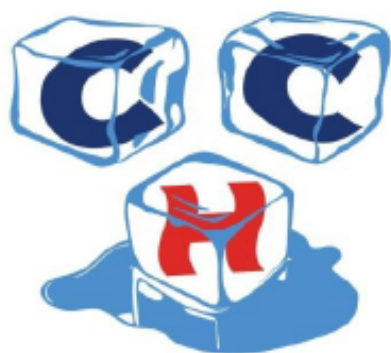

rented the middle third of the building where Matolis Pizza is located. Apparently they have been operating a shrimp processing and distribution business for the past five years without much of the community even being aware of its existence. The petitioners are supposed to get in touch with our POA as well as the South POA to arrange a meeting to explain their request. This meeting is to be followed by a Public Information Workshop (PIW) to allow us, the public, to hear what they have to say and to voice our concerns. From there it should go to P&Z, ie, follow the normal process for any such petition. Until the initial meeting has been set up, none of the process can begin. Kathy emphasized that their business will in no way benefit Hernando Beach in that it's strictly processing and shipping and reassured us that the GAC will stay on top of the situation and keep us informed.

#### BUSINESS:

1) Diane Greenwell expressed her support of tonight's format where there was ample time to hear information and to be better informed of important issues affecting our community and to be able to ask questions and express opinions.

2) Sarge Dendy reminded us that this year's Coastal Cleanup will be held on 9/21/19, an international project. It all begins at 8 AM at Linda Pedersen Park and will involve volunteers on foot and in boats. Please come out and support this important project.

3) Diane Greenwell thanked all in the community who reached out with donations of money and time to manage the "sunken vessel" incident.

4) Bill Jay reminded us of the Cardboard Boat Race which will be held on Oct. 12, beginning at 11 AM with kayak races. It's a funfilled day for all and will raise money for several worthwhile local causes.

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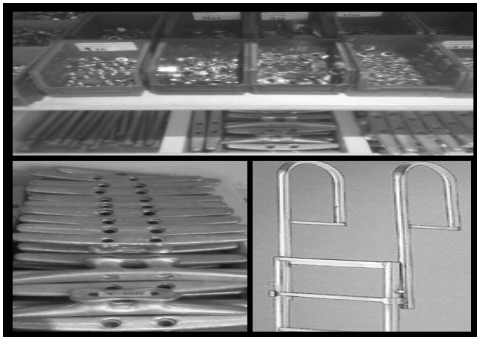


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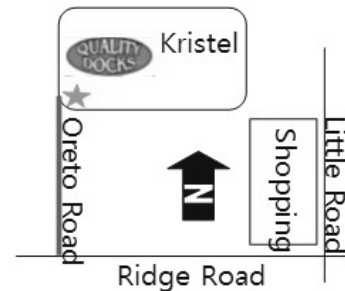
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## HBPOA IS ACCEPTING NOMINATIONS FOR OUR 2020 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

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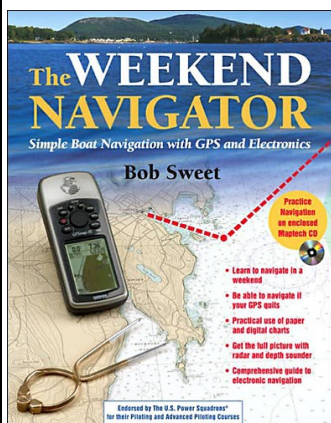

which can be taught separately.



Navigation has changed since the "old days" when navigators plotted a course relying on dead-reckoning and seeing a buoy was a bonus. Today we have inexpensive Global Positioning Systems (GPS) - even in our cell phones - that can enable you to pinpoint your position anywhere on the face of the

earth. However, while electronics can be very helpful, easy to use, and accurate, they can also break or quit. Knowing how to navigate with electronics is useful, but knowing how to navigate the traditional way using dividers, parallel rulers, and a compass could make the difference between survival and a catastrophe.

The Coast Guard Auxiliary's *Weekend Navigator* course combines our *Basic Navigation Course*, and our *Advanced Navigation* course,

The basic portions of *Weekend Navigator* are designed to give the student the rudiments of navigation by using GPS, and the back-up skill of navigation using charts, navigation plotting tools, and dead-reckoning. The intent is to provide the student with a solid foundation with emphasis on technique and not blind reliance on electronics. GPS will be mentioned and discussed as it relates to plotting waypoints, etc.

The advanced portion of the course covers the use of GPS and other electronic devices in more technical detail as well as some more sophisticated traditional navigation skills as back-ups. An added segment covers fuel management, which is the final crucial issue for all power boat navigation.

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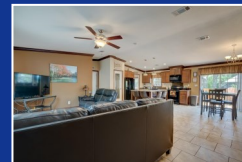

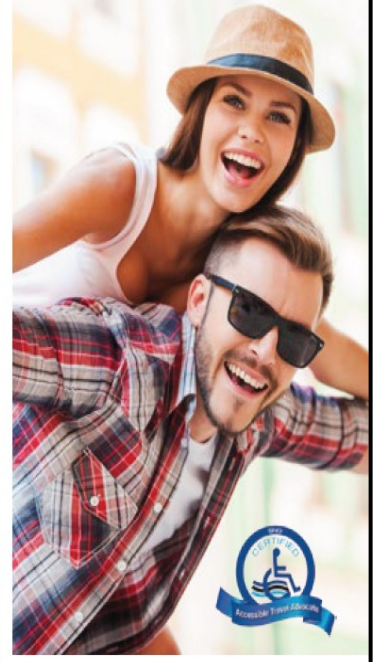


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### HERNANDO BEACH CRIME WATCH

The Hernando County Utilities Department (HCUD) announces the introduction of e-billing, a free service now available for all HCUD customers. This new service will allow customers to receive water bills much quicker than mailed statements and a notification can be sent via email when a new water bill becomes available. Current bills, along with up to 24 months of previous statements, are available for customers to view at their convenience. This new service is secure, easy to use and environmentally friendly.

How to set up your HCUD E-Billing account:

2. First time users will select the "click here to enroll" link
3. Enter your HCUD account number and service address exactly as it is printed on your billing statement
4. Read the "Terms and Conditions" and check the box to agree
5. An email will be sent to respond within 48 hours to activate your HCUD E-Billing account (check your spam/junk folder if it is not received)
6. After successful enrollment, only the login ID and password will be required to access your account
7. You will automatically receive an email when your HCUD bill statement is available to view

## BOATER EDUCATION IDENTIFICATION CARD

### Boating Safety ID Card Requirement

For anyone born on or after **January 1, 1988**, who will be operating a boat in Florida waters with an engine of ten (10) horsepower or more, the law requires them to complete an [approved boating safety course](#) and obtain a Florida Boating Safety ID Card. This card is not a boating license, it is a certification that the person named on the card has successfully completed the required boating safety course. The card does not expire. You can find information on how to obtain the card below.

FWC to issue a card. Many online course providers, and some classroom providers, automatically submit a ID card request to FWC for all of their students who successfully complete an approved Florida course. (Because the course providers are not affiliated with FWC, they must send student information to FWC in order for a card to be issued.) If your course provider automatically sends a request to FWC for your card, you should receive that card within 2 to 3 weeks.

- If the course provider or instructor is not going to submit the information for FWC to issue a card, you can do so using the course completion certificate you receive from the provider after you have passed the course. For online courses, make sure you can print a copy of this certificate from their website or that you can get an electronic copy. If you take a classroom course, make sure your instructor provides proof of completion. This proof can be a card or certificate, but in order for FWC to issue a boating safety ID card, the proof of completion must have the fol-

3. Address of the student
4. Date the course was completed

Most course completion cards/certificates will also have a statement (and logo) that says the course was approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA).

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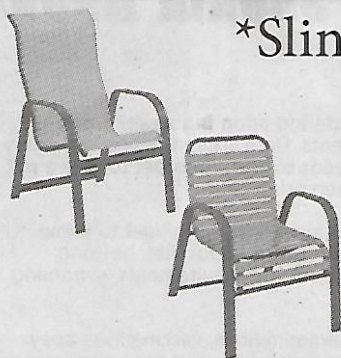
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## COASTAL CLEAN-UP

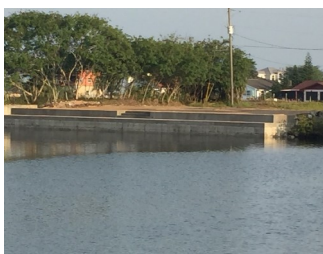
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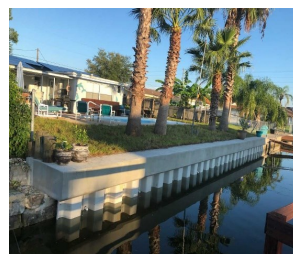
