We're always looking for members who'd like to help with the luncheon – especially with soliciting donations for our raffle in 2020. You can reach us at sjualumnae@gmail.com.



## **Journey of the Ursuline Nuns**

Last fall, Charleen White and her sister, Marie White Borovina ('66) travelled to Quebec City, Canada and visited Ecole des Ursulines, the first school for girls in North America. Founded in 1639 by Marie of the Incarnation, a French widow who entered the Ursuline monastery at Tours, France after her son began his formal education. After taking her final vows, Marie had a vision directing her to bring the Catholic faith to the New World. She arrived in Quebec City, New France in 1639 when the city consisted of six houses. Marie and her group established a convent and a school where they began teaching native Indians girls how to read and write. The school is still in existence today. As well as being an educator, Marie of the Incarnation was a prolific letter writer. The 8000 letters she wrote are one of the best sources of information on the founding of Canada. Canonized by Pope Francis in 2014, Marie of the Incarnation is considered the mother of the Canadian Catholic Church.
