 Woodward High School Reopening and Nontraditional Facilities Study Group (including WJ/DCC/Bethesda/Whitman clusters) A Board of Education hearing will be held on Thursday, March 9, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. at Carver Educational Services Center Auditorium, 850 Hungerford Drive, Rockville, MD on the Unity and Highland boundary study decisions and the two CIP amendments sent out earlier and summarized below.

Individuals wishing to testify on those topics **ONLY** (NOT General CIP requests/concerns or ongoing studies/groups [eg, RMES#5 or Woodward]) must register by calling 301-279-3617. Individuals calling to speak may reserve only one space and may not cede their time to others. (**Opportunity to sign up will end at 12:00 noon, March 8, the day before the hearing**.) Each speaker will receive 3 minutes to provide testimony and is requested to provide the written testimony no later than 5:00 p.m., the night before the hearing. (Please note: The three minute time limit applies to all speakers, except for elected officials, and the MCCPTA president, who will have five minutes to testify; and certain designated cluster representatives, who will receive 10 minutes.)

Amendment to the Board of Education's Requested FY 2018 Capital Budget and Amendments to the FY 2017-2022 Capital Improvements Program for Outdoor Play Space Maintenance Project

This is for \$750,000 to do a pilot of maintenance at 4 or 6 yet-to-be-identified schools play space. And yes, it can include attention to existing grass areas.

Amendment to the Board of Education's Requested FY 2018 Capital Budget and Amendments to the FY 2017-2022 Capital Improvements Program, Funding Expenditure Shift for Current Revitalization/ Expansion Project

This amendment is to shift planning money to next fiscal year for the next 4 rev/ex ES only, namely: Dufief, Stonegate, Cold Spring, and Belmont. At this time there will be no impact to the current timing of those schedules.

HOWEVER, NO new FACT scores or reordering of the queue are being put out/ being done at this time. That is tentatively scheduled for May 9th. Meaning that, subject to that review, the order may change hence the reason for moving the funding back a year.
