Fargo-Moorhead, ND Chapter #246 has 2 new members!!

The Fargo-Moorhead, ND Chapter #246 would like to welcome our two new members - Phyllis Phillips of Wanzek Construction and Joanna Slominski of Mortenson Construction.

Both were guests at our May meeting, Phyllis had sent in her membership the day of the meeting and Joanna sent hers in the following day. Thank you both, we look forward to learning more about your companies and getting to know you.

Joanna was also the presenter of our May program, giving us an overview of the new Sanford Medical Center under construction.

Here are a few of the interesting facts she shared about the project:

- Total dirt moved is just under 300,000 cubic yards or over 3.5 million wheelbarrow loads.
- Total erosion control fence installed is just under 14,000 feet that would circle the Fargodome over 8 times.
- Total linear feet of steel pipe pile is just under 97,000 feet or almost 270 football fields.
- There are over 3,100 doors which is enough keys to fill a 5' diameter keychain.
- There is an estimated 1.5 million square feet of drywall of enough to cover the Bison Sports arena 14 times.
- There is an estimated 1.5 million pounds of ductwork in the facility which is equal to the weight of a heard of 750 Bison.
- ~ There is enough air flow to fill 1 million balloons every minute.
- There is an anticipated 5.7 million linear feet of wire, enough to stretch from Fargo to Frisco, TX.

We look forward to future program opportunities as this project progresses.

SAFETY - LOCKOUT / TAGOUT (Taken from "Safety Puzzles for OSHA's Top Ten Violations)

What is a Lockout / Tagout?

Lockout/tagout (LOTO) refers to specific practices and procedures to safeguard employees from the unexpected energization or startup of machinery and equipment, or the release of hazardous energy during service or maintenance activities.

Workers injured on the job from exposure to hazardous energy lose an average of 24 work days for recuperation.

An effective lockout/tagout program should include the following:

- ✓ An inspection of equipment by a trained individual who is thoroughly familiar with the equipment operation and associated hazards
- ✓ Identification and labeling of lockout devices
- ✓ Purchase of locks, tags, and blocks
- ✓ A standard written operating procedure that is followed by all employees

In a U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics survey on injuries related to servicing equipment, 80 percent of workers surveyed failed to turn off the equipment before performing the service work.

Workers may be exposed to hazardous energy in several forms and combinations during installation, maintenance, service, or repair work. A comprehensive hazardous energy control program should address all forms of hazardous energy"

- *Kinetic (mechanical) energy* in the moving parts of mechanical systems
- Potential energy stored in pressure vessels, gas tanks, hydraulic or pneumatic systems, and springs (potential energy can be released as hazardous kinetic energy)
- Electrical energy from generated electrical power, static sources, or electrical storage devices (such as batteries or capacitors)
- Thermal energy (high or low temperature) resulting from mechanical work, radiation, chemical reaction, or electrical resistance.

Establish lockout/tagout programs that:

- Require workers to secure energy control devices with their own individually assigned locks and keys only one key for each lock the worker controls;
- Require that each lock used to secure an energy control device be clearly labeled with durable tags to indentify the worker assigned to the lock;
- Make sure that the worker who installs a lock is the one who removes it after all work has been completed; and
- If work is not completed when the shift changes, workers arriving on shift should apply their locks before departing workers remove their locks.






