John 6:60-69



"Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. 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Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

21st Sunday Ordinary Time Year B John 6:60-69

What do they say about 'tough love'? I understand 'tough love' to mean that there are times when people who love one another have to share or speak 'unpleasant, but true words' to each other. Maybe it is over serious matters such as risks to health, faith or life. These times come up whenever someone has to take action that is difficult but necessary, to protect and preserve the other person's life. I think today's gospel reading has Jesus expressing 'tough love' to us His followers. In chapter six of John's gospel, Jesus is laying down the truth that to be His follower, one must receive/consume His flesh and blood (6:56 "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him"—If we do not eat & drink this saving food, then Jesus had said, in verse 53 "then you do not have life within you."-That is a strong statement of His). John 6:60 tells us that 'Many' people left him and returned to their former ways after Jesus spoke this strongly. This moment of 'tough love' comes to a climax when Jesus asks His own 'called & chosen' apostles point blank, in John 6:67, "Do you also want to leave?" Determining who remains with Him and who leaves, comes down to who accepts on belief, Jesus' own statements that He will (somehow) feed us with His own Flesh and Blood. Yes, it is strong language, and Yes, we may not comprehend with our rational minds the mechanics of how God can give us eternal life through His Son's flesh and blood. YET, Jesus said it! And we are called to accept His words or not. That is faith in His Word. I suppose the 'many' who left have various different reasons for falling away, yet a definitive breaking point of either turning away or remaining with Him happens when Jesus asks them to believe on His word. 'Believing' is a step of trust beyond what the mind can rationalize and master for itself. I find it to be pure faith when we respond to Him, "Jesus you said it, and I believe it (even though I can't see it!)" That is what Peter replies to Jesus in John 6:68 when he says, "You have the words of eternal life."

Our understanding of the Holy Eucharist as Christ's Real Presence, is drawn from several places in scripture, but most clearly Jesus teaches it in this sixth chapter 6 of John's gospel. In John 6:55, Jesus pointedly says "For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." Such clarity and specificity I find is Jesus' acknowledgement that later generations would question the literalness of His words. Controversialists ask, "Is Jesus being literal here, or only figurative? Does He mean 'actual flesh and blood' or is He only talking symbolically? Is He stretching language to make a point?" I suggest that Jesus knows these questions will circulate in the minds that wish to revise His words, softening or minimizing them. He knows that 'many' are questioning His words even at the moment He speaks them as recorded in scripture. He demonstrates this awareness as He notes the departure of the previous believers. But we still hear such questions today, "Is Jesus being literal here or only exaggeratedly suggestive to add emphasis to His teaching?" I find that He must be as literal here as He ever is, because if He was only using symbolic 'figures of speech', He so easily could have called back the departing crowds to Him with apologies, clarifying that He was only exaggerating to make a point. But He didn't do that. He offers in a spirit of 'tough love' this freedom to accept Him on faith and remain in His word, or to leave and move on from being in His company. What I've always found to be a tipping point in favor of Jesus' literalness here is His use of 'IS' and 'MY' ('my flesh is true food'-6:55-repeated in another form in Matthew 26:26 'This is my body'). 'IS' speaks for itself, and anyone's use of 'MY' puts that own person on the line, indicating maybe the highest level of clarity and actuality- If I know anything, I should know it and state it about 'me'! But again, this whole chapter 6 of John as teaching of Jesus, is God's Word. I remember that back in the beginning of Jesus' public ministry He had claimed that 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God' (Matthew 4:4 quoting Deuteronomy 8:3). So, I find Jesus' Word is enough to live by. While I'm not able to fully explain how He makes 'His Flesh-Body-Blood' become my 'Food', I can accept and know it 'works' as I feel it within me and I am nourished by Him. By the Way, since it is our Savior Jesus who is the one who even miraculously rose from the dead, what could He not accomplish by His Word? Peace, Fr Brian


