Dear Church Family and Friends,

This is our challenge as Christians; to live our faith and let the love of Jesus shine, not just as a passionate interest, but in the midst of our passionate interests, as something that can be life changing for everyone. It is the right fit. We don't have to be perfect before we experience the love of God. *Romans 12:8* But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Can you bring someone with you to a Bible Study (zoom) or to church and help them to experience faith for themselves? Let your life be the precursor to the invitation. Let others see something they want in their own lives.

Now, I must find the channel that might be showing the Mars rover. Not my cup of tea, but Christianity is the best for everyone!


