The first day (Tuesday) he paddled Lake Canyon. Then he went down the main channel for about an hour or so. He didn't find any other camping between our spot and his turn around. Gary reports, "Lake Canyon was very nice to paddle up; it was a good side trip."

The second day (Wednesday) he headed

down lake for about two and a half hours and turned around a bit past Annie's Canyon, at about Mile 81. He found some nice spots which would be a good base camp for a couple of days of exploring Annie's and I ceberg Canyon.
