COG has authorized the drawdown of the first
funds for the revitalization of the playground
adjacent to the Community Center on 32nd
Avenue, and they're out for quotes and response
to requests for proposals for contractors to do
the design work for the playground. If
everyone recalls and if (inaudible) the
design format that they're looking at, a
modernized community playground, and hopefully
construction will start within the next
hopefully 45 to 60 days. Item C., I'd like to

Mr. Quattlebaum, Mr. Mayor, members of Atlantic Beach Town Council, a group of concerned residents are appealing to you this afternoon to express our collective disapproval of the Atlantic Beach, South Carolina proposed Redevelopment Public-Private Partnership, LLC. As concerned residents, we have been alerted to electronic and video documents pertaining to Partners, Incorporated's Development Town redesign. In our estimation, we feel the plan is concerning for many reasons to include, but not limited to, the following: We believe it lacks transparency to our residents who were overwhelmingly unaware o f its conceptualization. Wе believe it's not representative of citizen, resident and

business leaders' input and vision in its
planning and design. And we believe it poses
potential short-term and long-term displacement
hardship during execution, and drastically
undermines the essence of Atlantic Beach as an
intimate, residential beach community. We are
asking that you deny and reject any
consideration of this plan current and future.

Additionally, and perhaps most importantly, we
ask that you establish a community-based,
strategic development and historic preservation
committee, and this committee and group should
be comprised of various Atlantic Beach
residents and stakeholders so that we work with
you, with you, collaboratively in constructing
and orchestrating Atlantic Beach's next phase
and design. Many of the stakeholders, we've

expressed this formally and informally to you, and we are willing and ready to serve. that you will convene this committee quickly and engage willing stakeholders desiring to time, share their talents and respective treasures for the Black Pearl, Atlantic Beach.
