# On the Cruise Ship "Church of Jesus" Are You a Passenger or Serving Staff?

An older church leader said to me, "I'm so tired of the cruise ship mentality." I asked her to explain.

It's nice to be a passenger on a cruise ship. There is a small army of people who are focused on your comfort, your convenience, your entertainment, your desires. You come and go when you want, eat what you want when you want it, with no concern for the needs of others and no responsibility.

But what about in the church... this family of believers? Do you enter the church like a privileged passenger or like a servant? Are your expectations more selfcentered, or others-centered?

Are you concerned with who is carrying your serving responsibilities when you are absent? Are you carrying your share of responsibility?

Do you take notice of who "makes over you," or are you more concerned with whom you are loving and encouraging? Do you love your fellow Christians enough to be there for them faithfully—listening and encouraging as an others-centered servant?

Knowing that Jesus called and equipped us <u>all</u> to serve, can the "passenger" say with honesty that they are doing what He expects of them?

People with a Cruise Ship Passenger mentality quickly fall out of love with their church. Those who are serving faithfully and carrying the load for these "privileged passengers" don't have time to coddle the self-absorbed.

They have to know on some level that the Lord who gifted them and called them to serve cannot be pleased when they flatly refuse to do their part in the Kingdom. So worship loses depth, Jesus' voice is harder to hear, our relationships with other believers grow cold.

When Paul says, in Philippians 2, "have the same mindset as Christ Jesus," he goes on to describe sacrificial service, not personal privilege. We cannot be like Christ and still approach the church with a "passenger" attitude rather than a "servant" attitude.

Are you an unhappy "passenger"? You can always change churches! The people in the new church will treat you like a passenger at first. They'll make over you, stroke your ego, and expect nothing from you! But eventually, Christian, they will expect you to carry your part of the serving load every week, without constant coddling and attention. (Then it will be time to change churches again!)

In this new year, Christ calls us to *serve*, imitating Him, rather than to act like a privileged passenger on cruise ship "Church of Jesus." And that's where the joy is found!

We have amazing servants on this "ship" with great servant hearts! I hope you'll plan to be one of them as we "cruise" through 2022!
