It is a Vietnam Era K-Rations ("K-Rats").

"Meal Combat, Individual. Chicken, Boned B-3 Unit" 1-Can Boned Chicken, 1-Can White Bread, 1-Can Cookies with cocoa beverage powder spread, 1-Pack Sugar, Creamer, Salt and instant coffee, 3-Packs Toilet Paper, 1-Pack Wrigley's Spearmint gum, 1-Pack Matches and 2-Packs of cigarettes (four "Cigs" each)



Canned rations have been a staple since the American Revolution. In fact, many expeditions by the British Empire led to "Lead Poisoning" amongst their overseas crews due to the tin metal and the lead solder used to preserve them for up to four years.

Anyway, when I was in the service, I had my "P-38" can opener. It was the "key" to my sustenance and, yes, nutrition, as the Army saw it. I was thankful for my P-38.

Now, I am thankful for a roof over my head, food in my belly and a safe country to live in. I am full of thanks for my wife & best friend Diane, my family, our friends and Post 132. My thanks overflows from within when I consider my life's experience and my good health.
