President's Letter

Welcome to the beginning of our "Fall/Winter season". To our members who have endured the long hot summer, we have earned the cooler weather this fall season brings. The cooler weather here and the onset of winter weather in the northern parts also brings the annual migration of our Snow Birds.

Starting November 1st the club room will be open 4 days a week both morning and afternoon sessions. The morning hours are 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. with classes starting at 9:00 a.m. and usually are one hour long. The afternoon hours are 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. with one hour classes starting at 1:00 p.m..

This September Apple introduced 3 new iPhones: the iPhone 11 Pro max, iPhone11 pro, and the iPhone 11. The new iPhones began shipping September 20th. Apple also introduced a new Apple Watch (Series 5) and a new iPad (with a new 10.2 inch-screen).

The best news to come out of this year's announcement is that Apple has not increased prices on the new updated equipment. In fact, the new iPhone 11 at \$699.00 is \$50 less than last year's entry level phone price of \$750.00 (iPhone XR). You still get the XR at a discounted price of \$599.00.

Apple also released new software to take advantage of the new hardware. Apple has updated the iPhone OS to IOS 13.1.2. (iOS 13.1.2). A new iPad OS was introduced. (iPad OS13.1.2). This new iOS will add new functions to take advantage of the iPad larger screen size compared to the smaller iPhones.

Apple Watch OS was upgraded (watch OS 6.0.1).

Apple introduced a new streaming service called TV + .The new streaming service will stream tv programs produced by Apple

Apple will be entering the streaming market dominated by Netflix, Amazon Prime and Hulu this winter.

This is a major iOS update that has many new features. Club members may wish to wait a while before trying to upgrade. This allows Apple to correct any bugs that are discovered. (By the time you read this you should be good to go). Before upgrading, I STRONGLY recommends that you backup your files! I have upgraded my iPhone XS iPad Air 2, iPad Pro with no apparent problems.BUT always backup

before upgrading (I do this every time I upgrade.)

Apple will be upgrading the Mac OS sometime in October (Mac OS 10.15.0 Catalina). Along with new functionality this year the Mac OS will discontinue support for 32 bit programs. During this past year you may have seen the “this program is not optimized” when launching an application. These programs will not work with the new updated Mac OS. Programs that have been released the past 4-6 years have been optimized for 64 bit processing. I recommend that you check for these 32 bit programs before upgrading macOS10.15.

To find out if your Mac Application will run on the new OS, select the “Apple” icon top left on status bar. Select “About this Mac” from the drop down menu, a new window will appear. Select the “System Report button” a new window appears. Select “Applications” in the left column. The window on the right will display all the applications installed on your Mac.(this window may take time to load) Check on the far right to see the column named “64-Bit.” Scroll down to see what programs are 64Bit

(yes) or 32 Bit (No). If the program you are using is not 64 bit, do NOT upgrade. Do check with the application’s website to see if there is an update/upgrade that will run on Catalina before upgrading. This process will ensure that all your important programs will work after the upgrade. Remember always back up your data before doing any upgrades.

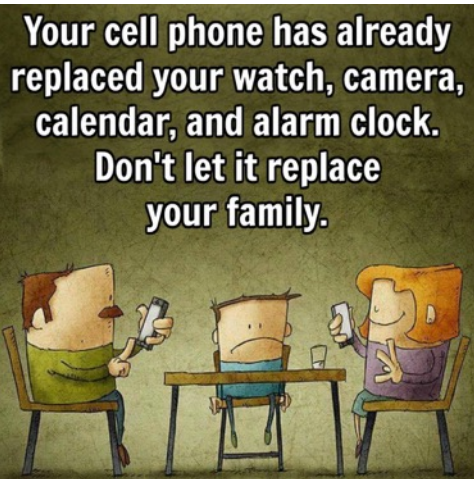
