



It prepares us for Christmas, when we recall Christ's first coming among us, and it is also a time when we look forward to his second coming at the end of the ages. Advent is a season of joyful expectation. During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The Old Testament readings, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the Apostles present exhortations and instructions on different themes of this season.







LOSS OF BIODIVERSITY

We can look back on certain high profile threats to a few species such as the effects of DDT on eagles or the disappearance of bees, which is complicating the pollination of our crops. The challenge faced by our fishing and shipping industries to protect the right whales is expensive and affects our Maritime provinces in a very real fashion. We may read a story or hear the news about any of these issues, but do we change our way of doing things? Are we conscious of the impact our lifestyle has on the environment and the flora and fauna that inhabit our world? Let us listen to Pope Francis:

34. It may well disturb us to learn of the extinction of mammals or birds, since they are more visible. But the good functioning of ecosystems also requires fungi, algae, worms, insects, reptiles and an innumerable variety of microorganisms. Some less numerous species, although generally unseen, nonetheless play a critical role in maintaining the equilibrium of a particular place. Human beings must intervene when a geosystem reaches a critical state. But nowadays, such intervention in nature has become more and more

frequent. As a consequence, serious problems arise, leading to further interventions; human activity becomes ubiquitous, with all the risks which this entails. Often a vicious circle results, as human intervention to resolve a problem further aggravates the situation. For example, many birds and insects which disappear due to synthetic agrotoxins are helpful for agriculture: their disappearance will have to be compensated for by yet other techniques which may well prove harmful. We must be grateful for the praiseworthy efforts being made by scientists and engineers dedicated to finding solutions to man-made problems. But a sober look at our world shows that the degree of human intervention, often in the service of business interests and consumerism, is actually making our earth less rich and beautiful, ever more limited and grey, even as technological advances and consumer goods continue to abound limitlessly. We seem to think



that we can substitute an irreplaceable and irretrievable beauty with something which we have created ourselves.

36. Caring for ecosystems demands far-sightedness, since no one looking for quick and easy profit is truly interested in their preservation. But the cost of the damage caused by such selfish lack of concern is much greater than the economic benefits to be obtained. Where certain species are destroyed or seriously harmed, the values involved are incalculable. We can be silent witnesses to terrible injustices if we think that we can obtain significant benefits by making the rest of humanity, present and future, pay the extremely high costs of environmental deterioration.

We encourage you to read this entire document. We invite you to an evening of reflection on this Monday December 5 @ 6:30pm. We have begun to make some positive changes to diminish our carbon footprint. Our geothermal heating and cooling system limits our use of fossil fuels. The switch to LED lighting is not only a better light more cheaply but its long life and efficiency is great for the environment. We are engaging with the recycling people to find better ways of disposing of the waste produced through our many programs in the Church. Please join us in making this a cleaner, more efficient world.


