In 2018 the Biennale is once again about paper. The exhibitions are never themed, but the eighteen international artists participating in this edition have something in common, besides the use of paper: they take inspiration from nature. This may even be in physical terms, making paper from pure plant fibres — cooked, flattened, dried and, sometimes, mixed with other natural ingredients. Paper pulp might be kneaded or poured into unique shapes, and once dry, cut, folded and twisted. After the museum there is an optional lunch at De Wit's Restaurant. Please keep your receipt from the museum, as in previous years this has entitled you to 10% reduction at De Wit's.
