

How Did the Disciples Die?

Peter - hung upside down by Nero 68AD

Andrew – crucified in Greece (X-shaped cross)

Bartholomew - flayed by a whip in Armenia

James - beheaded by Herod

John – a natural death in Ephesus – however, was burned in boiling oil by Emperor Domitian and sentenced to Patmos where it is believed he wrote Revelations before his release and settling in Ephesus with Jesus' mother

James the Less - thrown from the pinnacle of the temple (100 feet) and beaten to death – similar to James the brother of Jesus

Jude - crucified in Persia

Judas the Betrayer - took his own life, hanging

Matthew – impaled to the earth by spears and beheaded in Ethiopia

 ${f Matthias}$ – (replaced Judas) – stoned and beheaded late 1^{st} Century

Philip – impaled by iron hooks in his ankles and hung upside down

Simon - crucified

Thomas – stabbed with a spear and died in India

Paul – executed in Rome – last letter written was Timothy

4-24-22 On the Shores of Galilee

COULD IT BE THAT FAILURE/BROKENNESS/or LOSS is a necessary part of a believer's spiritual growth and experience?

REMEMBER--- we will have failures, but we will never be a failure until we give-up!

"OUR LIVES ARE NOT FUTILE.
OUR FAILURES ARE NOT FATAL.
OUR DEATHS ARE NOT FINAL." Max Lucado

God often uses failure to show us that God is WITH US ---THAT HE WILL NEVER LEAVE US NOR FORSAKE US!!!! When you do not know what to do --- revert to your roots and do what comes naturally --- and care for your essential needs and responsibilities of life and family...

Frustrations and uncertainties are a part of life --- but LOOK FOR JESUS on the SHORES OF YOUR LIFE --- and, the darkness of night WILL ALWAYS GIVE WAY to the breaking of a NEW DAY, A NEW DAWN.

The Disciples needed a new start and a renewed purpose. They were exhilarated, relieved and refreshed to realize the depth and breadth of Jesus' love, care, and sacrifice for them ... AND THAT Jesus still wanted them to be his "fishers of people." (Luke 5:4-11)

BOTTOM-LINE: John 21:1-14:

- 1. Jesus penetrates the darkness of despair and defeat.
- 2. Jesus shows us that out of death comes life.
- 3. Jesus reminds us that we must cast out our nets --- that we may fulfill the call he has put upon the life of his disciples --- YES, we are commissioned to be "fishers of the hearts and souls of ALL people!!!!"

- 4. Jesus is kind and good --- he WELCOMES US to the warmth and refreshment of his preparation of 'breakfast on the beach' in the loving acceptance of his care.
- 5. John records the events of this meeting, perhaps, because it was for John a day of dramatic, life-changing realization of the depth and breadth of God's love and care for him (and all people).

Summary of John 21:1-19:

- ❖ A wonderful breakfast was enjoyed!
- Jesus cares, forgives, and serves.
- Jesus recommissions the disciples to be "fishers of people."

Even Peter was re-instated!!!

- Jesus was firm: "Simon, son of John"
- Jesus was direct: "Feed my sheep" "Care for my sheep" and "FOLLOW ME"

Jesus' words to his disciples - "FOLLOW ME"

As we stand on the shores of our Galilee, Jesus seeks us and welcomes us – He wants us to truly realize and experience the miracle and work of the Easter Resurrection!!!!
