This opportunity is for Ramapo College students ONLY. Majors in environmental studies/science, education, sciences or related fields preferred. Recommendation letter from a dean/faculty member is required.

General Requirements

Average of 15 hrs/wk (full-time in summer)

- ★ Motivated and willing to take initiative
- ★ Good communication and follow up skills
- Outgoing and comfortable engaging with all ages, especially children
- Must have own transportation
- Previous camp counselor, environmental educator or program leader experience is preferable
- Knowledge of local flora and fauna, or willingness to learn

Responsibilities - Interns will learn to lead or assist with the following

- Summer nature camp, Jr. Naturalist program, and school break day camps
- Afterschool and homeschool environmental education programs
- School field trips (K-8 and special needs)
- Public programs and guided hikes and walks
- Scout programs and badges
- Gardening and grounds; including planting, maintenance and upkeep, invasive species management
- Interns will also develop and implement a project of their choice under the guidance of the Director
