Since our last church newsletter, the Green Team has received word from the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Environmental Ministries Program that Madison Presbyterian Church has been officially certified as a first year Earth Care Congregation (ECC) for 2018! This means that we have adopted the "Earth Care Pledge" to participate in actions that support Earth Care, in each of the four required areas of worship, education, facilities, and outreach.


As we reported earlier this year, the application involved completing an audit form showing the particular ways in which our church qualifies for the certification. Examples included everything from recycling some of our waste and having roadside cleanups, to having a Breakfast Buzz on the topic of agriculture in Madison County, to saving energy by having CFL lighting and double-pane windows.

Now that we are certified as an ECC, we will have the opportunity to apply for recertification every year, through continuing to encourage our church to participate in Earth Care in new ways. On Palm Sunday we arranged for the church to use Eco-Palms, harvested in ways that protect the rainforests where they grow and provide fair trade income for the growers and harvesters. Other new ideas for this year include: Green Minutes during morning worship, 2 or 3 field trips this summer, Breakfast Buzz on Light Pollution this fall, maybe even considering rain barrels for watering our flower beds. All ideas are welcome.

On April 22<sup>nd</sup> we will observe Earth Day at morning worship. Our pastor will be on vacation, and the Green Team will be in charge of planning the worship service and providing leadership for the service. Please contact anyone on the team if you would like to be involved in planning or leading Earth Day worship, or would like to join our team.
