## HOW DISABILITY RATINGS WORK

The VA determines a disability rating after reviewing your service medical records ("SMR"), C&P exam report and any other evidence submitted to them in support of your claim based upon the criteria below. You may have one or more symptoms in a higher disability rating, but still receive a lower rating that reflects where MOST of your symptoms are present. If you have multiple injuries, disability ratings are not added together ( $60\% + 40\% \neq 100\%$ ). The VA has an internal ranking system of injuries that will determine your final disability rating.

## COMMON RATINGS FOR DISEASES AND INJURIES OF THE SPINE

PERCENTAGE	DESCRIPTION
100%	Unfavorable ankylosis of the entire spine.
50%	Unfavorable ankylosis of the entire thoracolumbar spine.
40%	<ul> <li>Unfavorable ankylosis of the entire cervical spine; or,</li> <li>Forward flexion of the thoracolumbar spine 30 degrees or less; or,</li> <li>Favorable ankylosis of the entire thoracolumbar spine</li> </ul>
30%	<ul> <li>Forward flexion of the cervical spine 15 degrees or less; or,</li> <li>Favorable ankylosis of the entire cervical spine</li> </ul>
20%	<ul> <li>Forward flexion of the thoracolumbar spine greater than 30 degrees but not greater than 60 degrees; or,</li> <li>Forward flexion of the cervical spine greater than 15 degrees but not greater than 30 degrees; or,</li> <li>The combined range of motion of the thoracolumbar spine not greater than 120 degrees; or,</li> <li>The combined range of motion of the cervical spine not greater than 170 degrees; or,</li> <li>Muscle spasm or guarding severe enough to result in an abnormal gait or abnormal spinal contour such as scoliosis, reversed lordosis,</li> <li>Or abnormal kyphosis.</li> </ul>
10%	<ul> <li>Forward flexion of the thoracolumbar spine greater than 60 degrees but not greater than 85 degrees; or,</li> <li>Forward flexion of the cervical spine greater than 30 degrees but not greater than 40 degrees; or,</li> <li>Combined range of motion of the thoracolumbar spine greater than 120 degrees but not greater than 235 degrees; or,</li> </ul>

Combined range of motion of the cervical spine greater than 170 degrees but not greater than 335 degrees; or,
Muscle spasm, guarding, or localized tenderness not resulting in abnormal gait or abnormal spinal contour; or,

• Vertebral body fracture with loss of 50 percent or more of the height.

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## INTERVERTEBRAL DISC SYNDROME BASED ON INCAPACITATING EPISODES

PERCENTAGE	DESCRIPTION
60%	With incapacitating episodes having a total duration of at least 6 weeks during the past 12 months.
40%	With incapacitating episodes having a total duration of at least 4 weeks but less than 6 weeks during the past 12 months.
20%	With incapacitating episodes having a total duration of at least 2 weeks but less than 4 weeks during the past 12 months.
10%	With incapacitating episodes having a total duration of at least one week but less than 2 weeks during the past 12 months.

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
