urrent and planned changes in land use are before the Zoning Commission and then will come before the City Council. Both are on Randolph Blvd. between Landmark 35 Drive and Royal Ridge Drive. The result will be further commercial development including a Dollar General Store and a new building for A-Appliance on the west side of Randolph Blvd. Although additional development is to be expected, we have been successful thus far in restricting alcohol use and sales while agreeing to commercial zoning.

A change in the law went into effect on January 1, 2016. Your house numbers are required on your garage in the alley behind each house. In addition, individuals who offer to paint your house numbers on curbs or driveway must have a city license. Ask to see it. The city regulates the number size.

The green organics recycling containers were just delivered by Solid Waste Management. The large size (96 gallons) will come first, but you may request a small (48 gallon) container. There is no charge for this additional service, and you may also decline to receive the new container. Please keep in mind that each of us should store waste containers out of sight, except on collection days.

Finally, I want to discuss fair taxation. My purpose is for each of us to either (a) receive more services for the same amount of property taxes that we now pay, or (b) to pay a lesser amount with no change in services. By services, I mean police and fire protection, as well as waste collection, code enforcement and everything else we get from the city.



Fair taxation means that each property owner in Bexar County pays the same percentage based on the value of his or her property. Homestead exemptions would not be affected for residences. But, the problem in Texas is that commercial property owners pay less than residential property owners. What do I mean?

We need а law requiring disclosure of the sale price of property. If the appraisal district incorrectly under-appraises a hotel at \$300 million, when the actual sale price is \$600 million, then the commercial property underpays its fair share of taxes. Residential property owners are forced to make up the difference. Michael Morey discusses the topic in the 2010 issue of St. Mary's Law Review, Vol. 41, Pages 554-593, titled "Unequal and Unfair: Why Texas Should Require Mandatory Sales Price Disclosure To Reconcile the Texas Property Tax Code with the Texas Constitution.'

The Annual Meeting of the Royal Ridge Neighborhood Association (RRNA) will be Tuesday, October 4, 2016 from 6:00-8:00 PM at the Clubhouse, 5859 Royal Ridge Drive, together with the National *Night Out*. As the Chief Appraiser for the Bexar Appraisal District said, "when I want to see what houses are selling for in San Antonio, all I have to do is open the newspaper." That is not true of large commercial properties

Several sources showed increased property crime reports in our subdivision in late July and early August. I sent out an email "crime alert" at the time to those in our RRNA email address book and via Nextdoor to include subscribers in Royal Ridge, Randolph and Cheyenne Valley to alert them to the apparent uptick and offering prevention tips.

We have seen these upticks in the past and they are normally short lived, maybe because of neighbors taking increased precautions; increased vigilance and reporting of suspicious persons, vehicle and activities; increased San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) attention or maybe the ne'er-do'wells have moved to another location in the rotation. Officer Reno, our San Antonio Fear Free Environment (SAFFE) Officer, is aggressively investigating who may be responsible in our area.

Any number of reasons may have contributed to the increase, e.g. new construction and reroofing contractors "discovering" our neighborhoods, opportunistic actors near the end of summer, lax security on our part, etc. Property is being taken from unlocked vehicles, garages with open doors, outgoing mail (checks and personally identifying information), and lawn equipment, bikes, potted plants etc. from yards among the most common. Do away with these attractants and the problem will be minimized. We all need to do our part so as not to attract criminals to our neighborhoods.

Join us on *Tuesday, October 4*, from *6:00-8:00 PM* at the RRRC clubhouse for the *Annual RRNA Meeting* and *RRNA/RR Citizens on Patrol (RR COP) National Night Out* observance. County, City, and Community Leaders will be present and we expect representation from the Bexar County Sheriff's Office, Precinct 4 Constables office, San Antonio Police Department, Code Compliance, and San Antonio Fire Department Station 40 to drop in, address the group, take questions and address concerns. Plan now to attend and participate in the discussions, eat free food, and win prizes!

You are also invited to join us, RR COP, at any *second Monday monthly meeting* at the RRRC clubhouse beginning at **7:00 PM** where we discuss the past month's COP patrol reports and the monthly SAPD calls-for-service recap along with any other safety and security matters coming to our attention.

And, if you really want to help, take the SAPD COP training to be better prepared to notice and report suspicious activity in our neighborhoods or anywhere in San Antonio for that matter. Remaining *SAPD COP training classes* for this year are:




