## FREE PORTRAIT CLASS!

Youth ages 13-18 are invited to participate in a **FREE** four week visual arts portrait class, sponsored by the William Wilfred Campbell Society.

The program will survey drawing and painting portraiture techniques in a variety of styles culminating in students creating their own portrait of Campbell.

Completed artwork will be presented in an exhibition during June in Bluewater Park and be eligible for a \$250 "Katie" award, as well as used in WWCS promotional materials.

**All supplies included. Student MUST be able to attend ALL four sessions in Warton, running May 7, 14, 21, 28 from 6:30-9 pm.**

William Wilfred Campbell (1860-1918) spent his youth living in Warton, Ontario and was forever after influenced by the wild grandeur of the lake, land and shore landscapes of the Bruce Peninsula. History remembers him alongside other Confederation poets like Archibald Lampman and Bliss Carman, but the title of "Poet Laureate of The Lakes" remains his alone.

2014 marked the first William Wilfred Campbell Poetry Festival, the vision of the late Paul Kastner. Now entering its 6<sup>th</sup> year, the festival seeks to both honour Campbell's literary legacy and inspire further creativity in Grey and Bruce Counties.
