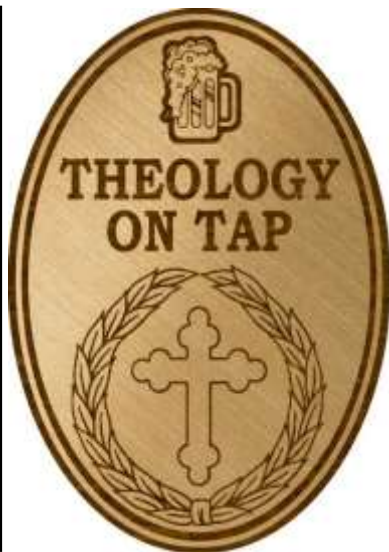

January 21, 2019

The LWML Executive Board met January 21, 2019, at 5:00 at church. The meeting was conducted by President Vicki Goforth.

Present: Thelma Miles, Alfie Moore, Vicki Goforth, Lisa Parrish, Linda Mueller, and Janet Livingston.

The minutes: of the previous Executive Board meeting were read by Vicki Goforth.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Linda Mueller presented report. The beginning balance as of 11/19/18 was \$425.65 with an ending balance of \$777.25 as of 1/21/19. Mites collected in December were \$73.77.

LWML served an Advent meal with half of the donations received sent to the Salvation Army and half given to the Beautiful Savior Youth. Proceeds from the Cookie Walk were shared with The Connection Homeless Shelter and Mission Central. The Tree of Love donations were given to the Gift of Hope.

Devotion: Mary Babcock led the devotion. Lisa Parrish agreed to be the new Christian Life Chairperson.

Reports: Thelma Miles, Human Care Chairperson, asked if LWML was interested in hosting a food drive for the Salvation Army again this spring; this was approved.

Leader Development Chairperson Alfie Moore shared information about the Lenten meals that LWML will host. The Executive Board decided to serve casseroles on March 13 and sloppy joes on March 27.

Correspondence was shared from the Salvation Army, Mission Central, and the LCMS Foundation thanking LWML for the donations received.

Old Business: The Tree of Love was a success with \$555 received in donations and given to Gift of Hope to help people facing cancer. Christmas decorations were taken down on January 5. The Cookie Walk was held on December 2. Half of the donations were sent to Mission Central who reported back that the funds went to Herb and Markie Burch, missionaries with local ties who are serving in Central America, and to The Connection Homeless Shelter. Judy Gross is serving as LWML representative for the Mission Clarity Project. A reminder about membership dues will be put in the church bulletin.

New Business: The 2019 Directory will be completed and placed in mailboxes as soon as all information is received. The suggestion was made to extend invitations to kitchen cleaning days to all LWML members and to possibly have more frequent cleaning days. April 6 will be the spring Zone Rally to be held at BSCL with the theme "Great is Thy Faithfulness".

Plans were discussed with final decisions to be made at the Feb. meeting. Information about the Fall Retreat was shared; it will be September 6-7 at Camp Covenant Cedars in Hordville. The results of the survey sheets were shared, with an agreement that LWML would like to host more activity nights, with an invitation for anyone to attend.
