

From our Pastor:

Dear Friends.

On March 1, we begin Lent with the Ash Wednesday Service at 7:00. We will offer the imposition of ashes. This is ancient symbolic act of recognizing our limitations and our own accountability for the times in our lives that we have failed to live up to the best that we are capable of. It is a public act, that marks a spiritual openess to change.

That's right, change. We cannot ask forgiveness without being willing to do differently in the future. If we are going to be different, we are going to change.

So this Lent we will talk about good change and bad. We will talk about being our best selves, and how that makes for a better community. We will talk about being open to suggestions from the Holy Spirit, that might be heard in the voice of a friend, a neighbor, from the Board of Deacons, and certainly from the Search Committee.

This year I will be preaching on the twin themes of maintaining a posture of confession, and being ready to accept that change is a necessary and an integral part of being a Christian. In fact, it is at the heart of why there is a Lenten Season at all.

You see the clock is ticking for the time you and I have together. The Committee is busy with interviews and deliberating. A new chapter in the life of Union Congregational UCC Church is about to begin, and you are called to open your hearts to welcome new possibilities.

On March 8, the Wednesday after Ash Wednesday, we will have a soup supper and then look together at some of the pictures I took on my trip to the Holy Land. You will see the ancient walls, and see the caves associated with the lands of Abraham, David, and Jesus

I will also share some of what I learned about the Occupation of the West Bank that is in evidence every day in this ancient and Holy Land. I will describe the Annexation of Jerusalem by Israel, that is not recognized by any other nation, and why that makes moving the US Embassy to Jerusalem a problem. I will help you to reflect on how the awareness of sin in others, should help us to recognize our own susceptibility to sin and rationalize ourselves out of recognizing our own failures.

My heart was heavy, as I recognized the justifications offered for the Occupation, sounded like the rhetoric of the new Administration in my own "free" country. And I was clear that what I saw was bad, and the vulnerability to the same disregard for others is apparent; in the USA, in Britain and in France, as Western Civilization faces the challenges of both terrorism, and loss of unearned privilege.

I look forward to walking the season of Lent with you in 2017, recognizing that Lent will and should change us.
