201: PART A "Keeping Schools Safe with Conscious Discipline: A Brain-Based Approach to Challenging B

This is a part one of a two-part session. Please also select session 301. This fast-paced workshop will empower teachers and caregivers to effectively handle behavior issues and conflicts, will be presented with the learning brain in mind and will include music, movement, and interaction. Participants will gain insight into the brain states indicated by difficult behaviors and brain-compatible guidelines for intervention. Through playful skill practice, conferees will internalize a fresh approach to everyday issues in the classroom and foster healthy, direct and respectful communication among children and adults in moments of upset.

202: PBS Kids and The City Library: Learning about Emotions with Daniel Tiger

KUED Kids and The City Library explore the social emotional aspect of child development through the PBS Kids research based program "Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood" and The City Library's story time techniques.

203: Transitioning to Better Transitions

Struggling with children during transitions? Come and learn some tips and tricks of the trade in a fun and engaging manner.

204: Empowered! Creating a Classroom Culture of Student Success (Must also Select Session 303)

205: Mindset in the Classroom and Beyond

206: Integration of Cognitive, Physical, and Social Development

207: Cowboy Ted's Get Outside - Get Active - Get Healthy Program

Cowboy Ted Hallisey uses his Cowboy persona and radio host and teaching experience to engage students to Get Outside - Get Active Get Healthy.

208: Working with bilingual students and creating a language and socially rich classroom environment

Working with children whose native language is not English can be challenging for the classroom teacher. This presentation will teach a variety of techniques, strategies and games that can be implemented within the classroom environment.

209: Growing and Learning in a Positive Social Emotional Environment

Creating positive learning environments for young children.

210: When I Play I Learn: Teaching Music with the Brain in Mind

This session will explore interactive mats and toys that encourage children's music play. Materials are designed for in-class teaching, for center music play, and for take-home to help parents and the children make music together.

211: 15 Minute Circle Times

15 Minute Circle Times are the key to successful and meaningful large group experiences. We will show you how to effectively plan curriculum that will spark children's interests and expand their learning all while being together in a large group.

212: I Started a Forest Preschool

Nature provides the curriculum for young children and helps them develop in each domain. This presentation focuses on how to run a forest preschool and use emergent curriculum to maximize children's learning and minimize behavior problems.

213: Harnessing Toddlers Power For Good Not Evil!

219: How to use puppets to teach and entertain

221: Making music come alive in a classroom

This class provides you with all these opportunities.

227: Encouraging Self-Regulation through Connecting Principles (This class is repeated in session 3)

Connecting Principles provide the foundation for healthy attachment and self-regulation. Learn engagement strategies that will strengthen and deepen your relationship with the children you care for and help them to gain self-regulation.

228: Moving and Grooving with Infants and Toddlers: Expanding Music Experiences to Enhance Brain Development

If you are looking for ways to incorporate more music activities with your infants and toddlers, this workshop is for you. We will explore fingerplays, dances, musical games, active listening, instrument exploration, and more. Go home with ideas you can start using immediately, and resources to continue expanding the music experiences in your classroom.

229: Creating an Integrated Social/Emotional Learning Environment for Infants and Toddlers

Children from birth to age three experience rapid brain growth and are 'learning to learn'. The right environment -both human and physical- sets the stage. This workshop will examine ways to integrate learning activities with the environment to support the social and emotional growth of infants and toddlers along with physical and cognitive development.

230: Using Conscious Discipline with Families

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231: Auditory Processing, Behavior and Maturity

Learn the power of auditory processing and simple strategies to improve it, and how it impacts global maturity and behavior.

232: Shared Services 101

This workshop introduces the concept of Shared Services in Early Care and Education.
