

The choicest of the first fruits you shall bring into the house of the Lord your God.



After some time Cain brought some of his harvest and gave it as an offering to the Lord. Then Abel brought the first lamb born to one of his sheep, killed it, and gave the best parts of it as an offering. The Lord was pleased with Abel and his offering, but he rejected Cain and his offering.

Genesis 4:3-5a

Dear Member of our All Saints' Faith Community,

As we read in the *Book of Genesis*, from the beginning God was pleased when the children of Adam and Eve offered sacrifices to God, from their **first fruits**. Such a sacrificial offering is a tremendous symbol of the love an individual has for God. The opposite is also true. God's displeasure was so apparent to Cain, because he gave God what was left over, the fruit of the ground, that Cain's offering was rejected, by God. His gift of leftovers being rejected angered Cain so much that the first murder recorded in Holy Scripture was perpetrated by him, against his own brother.

How generous have we been with our giving? Even more important, how generous will we be from today onward? When considering our giving back to God, we need to remember that when we give our money, this is the symbol of how much of our heart, how much of our love, we willingly give back to God. To a great extent, our giving patterns either that of Abel, or of Cain. We either give back to God from the first fruits of what God gives us, or we give God what is left over. Think seriously about this. What does it say about us, as individuals, if we only give what is left over to God? Based on the story of Abel and Cain, how pleasing is what you and I intentionally return to God? Is it a sacrifice at all, or merely an afterthought? Does what we give to God really represent our love of God, or is it time for you and me to reconsider our giving pattern, for the health of our immortal souls?

This November each of us will make our pledge for 2019, representing our best gift back to God for all God does for you and me; and we will place it on the offering plate, or send it into the church office. In a very real way, it is our official Thanksgiving Card to our Lord, for all God does for us each moment of every day.

Always keep in mind that God loves a cheerful giver, and is able to bless you and me with everything in abundance. It is true that people who really trust God's providence never fear giving, so they give the best they can. They give of their first fruits, out of love, and God loves us, no matter what. Do you believe this?


