"Nanny" to 6 grandchildren Lauren, Stephen, Robert III, Madeleine, Daniel and John. She was born and raised in Charlestown and moved with husband Bob to Houghs Neck in 1960. She dearly loved the back beach, her water view from Bayview Avenue and the tight knit and colorful Houghs Neck community that she called home for 57 years. She was very proud that she and Bob received the HNCC "Good Neighbor" award for their community participation and contributions that made the Neck such a beloved place for her. As the "friendly village seamstress", she sent many Houghs Neck brides down the aisle, creating elegant custom designs for entire wedding parties, as well as prom dresses, maternity, vacation and many other special occasion fashions for family, friends and neighbors. The sewing room at 80 Bayview Ave was always a beehive of artistic and creative frenzy that she absolutely thrived on. Virginia was a dependable member of the Most Blessed Sacrament choir, and while she could, lifted her voice to God's glory every Sunday. She taught CCD and was active in PTA and school activities during her children's school years, and later as a Reading Round-Up volunteer. The Kamb family would like to express our profound gratitude for the kindness, attention and care of so many neighbors and friends in the Neck who comforted our mother (and us) in her final days. The Houghs Neck

"it takes a village" spirit sustained us all right to the end. In tribute to her memory and the Houghs Neck community that brought her so much joy, happiness and satisfaction, the family encourages donations to the H.N.C.C. Scholarship Fund.

William "Dice" Galloway age 84 died on July 18th. Best known for as a member of the doo-wop band The Harptones in the 1950s, but locals will remember William "Dice" Galloway for his habit of singing to himself as he bagged groceries at the Shaw's supermarket on Quincy Avenue. A Houghs Neck resident and Vocal Group Hall of Fame member. He was a baritone, was a founding member of The Harptones, a Manhattan-based group best known for their hit "Sunday Kind of Love." He served in the Army during the Korean War. "It was a thrill when one of us would be walking down the street and we'd hear our song playing on a car radio," Galloway told The Patriot Ledger in a 1995 interview. "It's sad but true that the artists of that era were denied the royalties and much of the fame and recognition they deserved, In 1998, Galloway was honored as a musical pioneer by the Rhythm & Blues Foundation. In 2002, he performed with The Harptones again at Boston's Symphony Hall when the group was inducted into the Vocal Group Hall of Fame. Husband of Joyce Fitzgerald Galloway, six children, three sisters, 12 grandchildren. A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 12, at Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses, 29 Parkman St., Dorchester.

This is one of the longest consecutively running blood drives in our region. Since the first drive in 1985 over 3,000 donations have been collected. This is outstanding. Without the support of hosts like the community council and the generosity of the selfless donors we would be lost. You truly are lifesavers. Each day our organization must collect approximately 14,000 pints of blood in order to meet the needs of the hospitals and patients.

For your most recent drive we registered 48 donors, had 4 deferrals, 3 donors with insufficient quantity, and collected 45 donations. You even had 5 first-time donors. The 45 donations have the power to save up to 135 lives. Including these results, the Chris Peter Memorial Blood Drive has collected 3,010 donations. I can't even begin to imagine how many lives have been positively impacted because of your work. SAVE THE BELFRY FUND



Houghs Neck Congregational Church

Dear Friend:

For many years the HNCC has been a foundation in the Houghs Neck Community. We are more than a building - we are a symbol of what "community" is all about. Our church is not large in size but it is in heart. We are a very active group, holding annual events to benefit members and the community at large such as Breakfast with Santa, The Chili Cool-Off, A Princess Tea, Strawberry Festival, the Annual Lobster/Fish Dinner; and hosting a baked goods table at the ChowdaFest with all proceeds going to a local charity. We are also supportive of some of Quincy's non-profit organizations such as Interfaith Social Services, DOVE, Inc. and the Quincy Animal Shelter.

Houghs Neck Congregational Church needs your help. After all these years, the granite façade and belfry for which our church is famous are in much need of repair. Our bells have been heard many a Sunday morning as a call to worship but have also been tolled for weddings, in response to the deaths of Presidents, to honor those who lost their lives on 9/11 and during our country's bicentennial. It has become a source of pride to our tight-knit community.

The Community Preservation Act through the City of Quincy has awarded the Houghs Neck Congregational Church funds to assist in those repairs but we must also raise \$15,000 in order to complete the restoration. The repairs are extensive and they need to be done as soon as possible to prevent any more damage. The granite façade needs to be restored to its original condition so that it can once again withstand the elements of nature, thus stabilizing the structure of the belfry.

On behalf of the Houghs Neck Congregational Church Council, we ask that you please consider a generous donation to help us meet our goal of completing the restoration work that needs so desperately to be done. This "Save the Belfry" project is about the restoration, yes, but it will also allow our church to continue to serve our community as it has for 122 years.

Dear Houghs Neck Residents,
 Due to a series of events in the House of Representatives, I was recommended by Speaker DeLeo and unanimously elected by the Democratic caucus to be appointed Chair to the Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure on July 17th. The opportunity was created by the resignation of Representative Brian Dempsey (D-Haverhill), who was the Chair of the House Committee on Ways and Means. Because of Representative Dempsey's resignation, a domino effect was started over three committees. Representative Jeffery Sanchez (D-Boston) was appointed to the House Committee on Ways and Means from the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing. Representative Peter Kocot (D-Northampton) was appointed to the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing from the Joint Committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight. Representative Jennifer Benson (D-Lunenburg) was appointed to the Joint Committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight, leaving open the Chairmanship for the Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. I am thankful to the Democratic Caucus for this opportunity and humbled by their faith in me to lead this committee.

The Senate Co-Chair of the committee is Barbara L'Italien (D-Andover) and I look forward to working with her throughout the rest

of this session. Currently, there is no Senate Vice-Chair because Senator James Timilty (D-Walpole) resigned in May to become the new Norfolk County Treasurer. The House Vice-Chair is Daniel Hunt (D-Boston) who represents a precinct in Quincy. The Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure has 229 bills thus far. The committee oversees a number of consumer related policy areas including alcohol licensing, the state lottery, horse racing industry, non-medically related boards of registration, car franchises, and licensing of new professions. I had to move offices for the second time in three months due to the new committee assignment. My new office is in Room 42 of the State House and the phone number is 617-722-2014. If you are in the area, please visit.

I am no longer the Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy. I will retain my other committee assignments on the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing, Joint Committee on Election Laws and Joint Committee on Marijuana until September. For the most part, in the House of Representatives, committee chairs do not have other committee assignments. There are currently special elections to fill two representative seats. These were created by the passing of Representative Gailanne Cariddi (D-North Adams), who was elected in 2010, and the aforementioned resignation of Representative Brian Dempsey, who was elected in

1990. Once the special elections are complete, some committee assignments will be rearranged and appointments made for the two new representatives.

The fiscal year 2018 state budget has been signed into law. The House-Senate Conference Committee reduced state revenue projections to 3% from the Governor's projection of 4%. This resulted in a \$733 million reduction from the House and Senate versions of the state budget. Despite this revenue projection challenge, the state delegation was able to secure funding specifically for Quincy. However, Governor Baker vetoed all the Quincy funding. \$900,000 was committed to the state owned beaches within Boston Harbor, including Wollaston Beach. There was a commitment of \$50,000 to Germantown Neighborhood Center

and \$100,000 to Quincy Asian Resources, Inc. The Quincy Fire Department had \$50,000 dedicated to the hazmat program. \$100,000 was dedicated to be used for safety improvements at the Adam's family tombs at the United First Parish Church. \$100,000 was designated to Quincy to help with establishing the infrastructure for a commuter ferry service from Squantum Point Park. The State Police received \$95,000 in overtime patrols along Quincy Shore Drive and Furnace Brook Parkway. The Quincy Department of Elder Affairs received \$25,000 to fund its programs. The Quincy Delegation is working with their respective branches to override the Governor's vetoes.

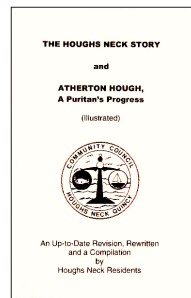

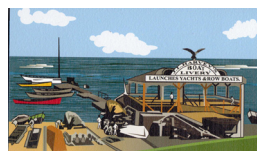

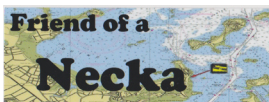
