Tennis Courts Survey
The HOA board has solicited bids for renovation of the tennis
courts. The bids were
structured so that we
would have several options to consider for the
project. Several of the
options would require
an assessment to each
homeowner. The Board
has elected to table
those bids. Options are
as follows:

1. Conventional Crack
Fill Clean floral from
cracks and sterilize,
sand cracks flush with
court surface. Clean
cracks full depth. Fill
cracks full depth with
Acrylic Fiber Cement
and sand smooth. Apply
2 Coat tennis Court
Color System over

cracks. Blue inside playing area Light Green outside playing area. Stripe 2" white tennis lines with textured line paint per USTA regulations. Blow courts clean of dirt and debris.

2. Crack Fill and Resurface Powerwash sports court with 4000psi power washer, remove all delaminated material and haul off. Sand all cracks flush with court surface. Clean cracks full depth. Fill cracks full depth with **Acrylic Fiber Cement** and sand smooth. Apply 1 coat black acrylic sand coat. Apply 2 Coat Tennis Court Color System. Blue inside playing area Light Green outside playing area. Stripe 2" white tennis lines with textured line paint per USTA regulations. Association to provide water for flushing.

\$11,600.00

3. Crack Fill and Resurface, Using Guardian Crack Repair System
Powerwash sports court with 4000psi power washer, remove all delaminated material and haul off. Sand all cracks flush with court surface. Clean cracks full depth. Fill cracks full depth with Acrylic Fiber Cement and sand smooth.

Apply Guardian Crack Repair System per manufacturers specifications. Apply 1 coat black acrylic sand coat. Apply 2 Coat Tennis Court Color System. Blue inside playing area Light Green outside playing area. Stripe 2" white tennis lines with textured line paint per USTA regulations. Association to provide water for flushing.

4. **Demolish Tennis Courts**. Demo and haul off 2 tennis courts; 14,400 sq ft. including steel fencing. Bid includes traffic control and permits on Parker Road. \$22,000.00

The Psychology of Meetings

Resource Topic: Governance Meetings By: Loura K. Sanchez and Robbie Ruhaak

Do you hate board meetings? If your answer is yes, have you ever asked yourself why? Is it because everyone in attendance is not engaged or maybe you simply do you not care for the discussion topic? Maybe you find yourself spending more time wondering what everyone else is thinking and how that translates into their behavior. The latter is what we refer to as the psychology of meetings. Analyzing who participates in meetings and why, helps us understand how to conduct effective and productive meetings where everyone walks away feeling they have gained something in way of knowledge or perspective.

Although there is a lot of research out there on the psychology of meetings, Psychologist Albert Bandura has formed his thoughts of social cognitive theory based on the concept of self-efficacy. According to Bandura, self-efficacy is a person's belief in his or her ability to succeed in a particular situation and people

think, behave, and react based on that belief. People attend meetings for various reasons:

- o to obtain information
- o to launch complaints
- o to make decisions
- o as a requirement of employment/position

By creating an environment where all participants feel a meeting has value, and each participant believes he/she can produce an effect at the meeting, you will have better meetings. To do this, start by familiarizing yourself with different behavioral types:

- Barker and Biters
- Constant Complainers
- o Silent Sufferers
- o Silent Steamers
- o Wet Blankets
- o Know-It-Alls
- o The Great Pretender
- o Wafflers

Knowing that different participants have different needs, start by truly listening to what a participant is saying and not saying. Really pay attention, give encouragement, and validate feelings. It is important to engage the attendees and ask for thoughts and viewpoints. People who feel they have a voice and their opinion is



valued will be more likely to interact and be a productive participant rather than a "Negative Nelly".

You can also make sure all participants' needs get addressed by:

- o Having an agenda
- o Establishing ground rules for the meeting process
- Validating opinions
- o Providing opportunities for self-discovery
- o Knowing your audience and mold your content and communication style to fit
- Restating important items
- o Remaining unbiased
- o Asking clarifying and openended questions
- Providing varying perspectives
- o Promoting personal responsibility
- o Encouraging movement toward a solution
- o Allowing time for questions
