

## SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGICAL EVOLUTION IN EAST INDIAMEN SHIPPING (1600-1858)

### Work plan (April 2015 – September 2016)

When?	What?
April / May 2015	Research and outreach - Visit a number of groups and community centres, museums, etc.
May 2015	Press release / publicity / information dissemination
June 2015	An open evening to provide project information directly to the public – St Matthias Community Centre
July 2015	Recruit twelve volunteer Heritage Explorers – open recruitment. Recruit five volunteer Heritage Explorers by Strawberry Hill House
June / July 2015	Establish project steering group
August / Sept 2015	Group visit workshops to National Maritime Museum, Victoria & Albert Museum, British Library, Strawberry Hill House
August–Oct 2015	Three day theoretical training course on science and technological evolution in East India Shipping (1600-1858) and ship model making
Aug 2015 – Jan 2016	Heritage Explorers undertake initial research
Sep – Nov 2015	Monthly support, progress and experiences sharing sessions
Sept 2015 - Jun 2016	Three community workshops, one with disabled groups
January 2016	Heritage Explorers submit regular short articles to be published on Stepney Community Trust website.
March / April 2016	Heritage Explorers choose a particular East India Company ship and draw up specifications for commissioning Premier Ship Models to build a museum quality ship model about 1 meter in length.
February 2016	Premier Ship Model completes the commissioned museum quality ship model
February - June 2016	Heritage Explorers submit their chapters for editing and book editing, designing and printing
May 2016	Project celebration at the National Maritime Museum
June 2016	Project details uploaded on Stepney Community Trust website, including a learning resources for schools, colleges, community
July – Sept 2016	Exhibition at Rich Mix Centre, Strawberry Hill House and St Matthias Community Centre (East India Company Church)
