### **Male spouses can now join the Auxiliary!**

In addition to the expanded eligibility dates approved through the LEGION Act, the American Legion Auxiliary has approved extending membership to male spouses of veterans and current service members. During the National Convention in Indianapolis in August, delegates voted to replace the word "wife" with "spouse" in the Auxiliary constitution and bylaws. Currently, 1.9 million women veterans are living in the United States, and 9% of the U.S. military is female. As we welcome eligible male spouses into the Auxiliary, we gain another perspective on the needs of military families. This new membership eligibility has much promise for growth of the Auxiliary, leading to new resources, increased funding opportunities, and additional diversity and talent.

Greetings Auxiliary!  
We've done so much in the past 2 months, as you can see from the photos here, and have a lot planned through the first of the year. I hope you all make plans to join us during these upcoming events.

This month I'd like to talk about thanking our veterans on Veterans Day. We all know how important it is to thank our veterans for their service to our country. This year, and not only for Veterans Day, I'd like to ask each of you to sincerely thank all of the female veterans you know or happen to meet. They don't always bring attention to themselves, you won't typically find them wearing jackets or ball caps proclaiming themselves veterans. Not only have these women volunteered to stand side by side with their male brothers-in-arms to protect and serve our country, they have done so under incredible and sometimes hostile circumstances.

Until fairly recently the idea of having females in our military was almost unheard of, frowned upon, and protested against. Especially those women who choose to apply to the three military academies, the Air Force Academy in Colorado, the Naval Academy at Annapolis and The Military Academy at WestPoint. These institutions have been in operation for some 200 years and have only accepted women into their ranks since 1976. And despite all efforts to alter policies and make women feel accepted, they still face an uphill battle... to put it mildly. For instance, a 2016 report showed that approx. 25% of female cadets (and midshipmen) suffered unwanted sexual contact and harassment during their time at military academies. Not only did these women voluntarily choose to put themselves through some of the most physically and mentally demanding courses of study available, they did so under incredible pressure. Sincerely thank these women who have endured and accomplished so much for the privilege of serving their country.




**Waine D. Kanack**


