Spring, A Time For (Spiritual) Growth

I'll let you in on a secret, I'm not a farmer. I love to eat veggies I'm just not any good at growing them. But spring and gardening season are upon us so I want to share with you something interesting I read about growing asparagus and a



spiritual lesson for us. The farmer begins in the early spring with his prepared soil and plants his asparagus seeds. Once the asparagus starts growing, it grows fast. Some claim the growth can be seven or more inches in a day, others have said, leave for a weeklong trip, and upon your return you may find the tender spears have shot up to over three feet tall! Now stay with me, where there was nothing but good soil, growth can burst up in a short time and at an amazing speed. Our spiritual growth should be like the asparagus! Compare the opposite to the slow growth of the White Cedar of Canada, which I read that after 155 years, one grew to a height of 4 inches (not very impressive).

It's springtime, it's time to grow. We are told to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18). To grow spiritually, the soil of our heart must be "good", where there is faith in Christ, the soil is good (Matt. 13:1-23). We have to make sure there are no "roots of bitterness" and "unforgiveness." The bible says those bitter roots cause trouble and defile us (Heb. 12:15). Then we are to take up company with God's people, delight in the Bible, meditate on it each day, and we will be like a tree planted by a river of water that always is green and growing, and our leaves never wither (Ps. 1:1-3). We will grow spiritually and shoot up spiritually strong and healthy.

Hey, it's springtime, time to grow! Not just flowers and veggies but grow spiritually. So let's read our Bible, let it find a place in the soil of our heart, and spend time with God's people in God's House and we will grow. It's Spring, a great season to grow.
