

St. Mark's Lutheran family and friends,

Welcome to another day held gently in the loving arms of God. Here we are moving steadily through June and the days are hot... even when you are on vacation. And for vacation this year it was back out to Colorado to see Faith, with two of my favorite traveling companions ever... my mom and Elyse.

Now normally I have so much stuff I want to do when on vacation, places to go, things to see, people to visit. This year was a bit different, I deviated from my normal... get there at all speed possible. Instead we visited a friend on the way. We stopped and ate breakfast. It was a new pattern, a start of something new... a new beginning.

Summer is often a great time for new beginnings. It's a good time to try a new trail, start a new fitness routine, try a new sport (Frisbee/disc golf for me), read a new book, learn to play an instrument, start a new prayer practice, or even start a new devotional practice.

What does the bible say about new beginnings? 2nd Corinthians 5:17 says, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" Christ brings renewal. As we can change our faith habits and our fitness habits to make us into a new better version of ourselves... Christ, as we submit to his amazing plan, makes us into a new creation. Paul tells us that as believers we have died with Christ and no longer live for ourselves. Our "death" is that of our old sinful nature which was nailed to the cross with Christ. It was buried with Him, and just as He was raised up by the Father, so are we raised up to "walk in newness of life" Romans 6:4.

So celebrate that newness, tell of the good things God is doing in your life. Tell your friends about the new book you are reading or the new exercise program you are trying. Share your new devotion practice with a good friend and see your faith grows in leaps and bounds. Share a new prayer practice you are trying with your loved ones. In confirmation two of the students said that they never pray: not in the morning, at meals, or at night. Beloved, let's be about modeling our prayer practices for them to see... this is a vital and important part of our Christian life.

This month, as I come to a close, I leave you with a prayer. Gracious God, no matter what our circumstances, please help us to remember that we are a blessed and holy people, not holy by what we have done, holy because of what You have done for us through Jesus Christ our Lord. Help us to remember to give thanks for the beauty around us, because this world and all that is in it, was made by your hands. Help us too, to come to you daily with our joys and our pain, knowing you walk with us in all things. Lastly help us to believe, and grant us a deep strong faith, so that we can share your Word with conviction in a world in need of hope, love, and good news. All this we pray in Jesus name. Amen.


St. Mark's Building Fund drive
