



## Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11





# Our Youth Group is going to New Orleans in July of 2024 for the National Youth Gathering.



## Here is how you can help them on their journey.

We have six youth and two adult leaders heading to New Orleans in July of 2024 for the National Youth Gathering. This is a time for our youth to grow in their faith and as an overall youth group. You will see the youth active in different ways throughout the year and we ask that you help us get to New Orleans.

As we raise funds, watch the airplane take off from RDU (Durham, NC) to MSY (New Orleans, LA).
