# TRIBUTE TO THE RAPPAPORTS By Paul Landman

Most of us remember Stu and Annie Rappaport as highly involved members of the Art Association. Annie was a volunteer teacher for the Portrait Class along with Patti Rook. She also served as the Association's corresponding secretary. Any of us who received guided instruction from her or were cheerfully coerced into posing for the class, or who received a "get well" or "sympathy" card from her, knows of her love for art and dedication to the Association. She received the Executive Board Award for Outstanding Service in 2015.

Stuart Rappaport was her biggest fan, an accomplished lawyer, who finished his career as the Public Defender for Santa Clara County, California. His skill at public speaking and interpersonal relations, an interest in art, and an instinct to be of service, led him to become President of the Art Association in 2014-2015. He continued to serve on the Executive Board through 2021.

But to my wife, Stephanie, and I, Stu and Annie were more than that, they were our friends. We met at an LWV Art Show Reception in 2008 and hit it off rather quickly. We were interested in art, of course, but also found common ground in love of travel, healthful food, and to my great surprise, sports. They traveled to France to visit museums, historical sites, and enjoy French cuisine. We did too.

They loved vegetarian and Italian food, so did we. Stu played football in high school and college, and so did I. Stu was a big fan of the University of Michigan football; I loved the Spartans of Michigan State. He loved the Detroit Lions and Tigers; I loved the New York Yankees and Giants. We spent many hours reminiscing about the accomplishments of our favorite teams and players.

Annie painted many pictures of athletes in action, especially football players. Stephanie didn't paint but she baked terrific brownies. So tasty, that Stu and Annie always liked to come to our house for dessert after our monthly dinners at Villa Roma.

If that wasn't enough in common to sustain a friendship, we also had an avid interest in current events, and spent hours in exhaustive conversations about the issues of our times. No solutions, mind you, just exhaustive conversations, that left us tired but feeling sated. We could discuss the law, history, food, movies and TV shows, even politics, respectfully and with great humor. Most of all, the Rappaports loved to laugh. I believe their ability to laugh at themselves and at life contributed to the fullness of it.

It was a tragic surprise when Annie was diagnosed with cancer about the time that Covid arrived. She left us so suddenly, but bravely, more concerned with the wellbeing of her beloved Stu. I was a student in her class at the time and to this day, I miss my art teacher and friend. Steph and I continued to have monthly dinners with Stu for two years after he lost Annie. It gradually became clear that her absence was taking its toll. A week before he passed, we went to his house to meet for dinner. He was not well and apologized for not keeping the date. His son, Doug, soon arrived to take him to the hospital, where he remained until his passing.

Apart from the loss of a second cherished friend, the LWV community and the state lost a great citizen.

Rest in peace, Rappaports! You are home together. Quality lives fully lived. Your loving family

### **Selections from the Permanent Collection - Ongoing**

Black and White: Contemporary Art from the Frederick R. Weisman Art Foundation July 2, 2022-October 9, 2022. 30 artworks are a cross-section of works by artists who share attention to black and white—as palate and, in some cases, as theme. This selection demonstrates a diverse array of the artistic approaches, materials, and techniques that Southern California-based artists have deployed over the past half century.

**Your Place in the Multiverse: Jean Lowe** March 19 - September 18, 2022 A survey of Lowe's work from the past 20 years.

**Striking Figures: Francis De Erdely** May 14, 2022 - October 23, 2022 Known for his social realist paintings of everyday people as a way of addressing issues of race, culture, and social strata in Southern California, this is the first major exhibition of his work.

**Southern California Portraits: Francis De Erdely & John Sonsini** June 10, 2022 - October 23, 2022. Known for his portraits of men, typically people unknown to him, selected based on the personas they convey.

Her Great Gift: The Nancy Dustin Wall Moure Collection - August 28, 2022.-February 12, 2023. The exhibition focuses on 40 artworks made from the 1830s through the 1970s that traces how artists documented the California experience. Mortensen was a maverick photographer. Despised by many of his contemporaries for his grotesque subject matter and extreme manipulation of his photographs, Ansel Adams went so far as to call him the "anti-Christ" of photography. This is one of the only museum exhibitions of his work, illustrating **Photography and Seduction: William Mortensen's**
