AN ORDINANCE HIRING CAITLYN POWELL AS A PART TIME POLICE OFFICER FOR AMELIA VILLAGE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The Mayor of Amelia Village after conferring with the Police Chief, has recommended the hiring of Caitlyn Powell as a part time police officer for Amelia Village, and;

WHEREAS, The Council of Amelia Village concurs in the appointment of Caitlyn Powell as a part time Amelia police officer.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, that;

SECTION I. Caitlyn Powell is hereby employed as a part time police officer of Amelia Village, effective February 27, 2017 at a starting salary of \$14.00 per hour.

SECTION II. This offer of employment is contingent upon Ms. Powell passing pre-employment medical and/or psychological examinations and drug screening to ensure that Ms. Powell is physically and mentally able to perform the duties of police officer.

SECTION III. This offer of employment is also contingent on the fact that if Ms. Powell does not remain employed by Amelia Village for a period of two years, she must repay to Amelia Village the cost of her uniforms and any training she receives as a police officer while employed by Amelia Village.

SECTION IV. Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION V. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the Village. The reason for such necessity is that the Police Department of Amelia Village has recently lost several police officers and this appointment will allow the Village to provide the necessary police protection to the citizens of the Village. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Mr. Campbell moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings on three separate dates.

Mr. Fite seconded the motion.
