It could be seen from the air.


Usually we are traveling at Christmastime, either going to one of our Convocations somewhere or to our relatives to be with them at this family time of the year. My husband and I often talk as we ride along that at least once a year people who never think of Christ at all must be made aware in many ways that this is His birthday. Who else or what else could or ever has made such a stir and caused so many lights to be ablase year after year in every little town and hamlet, even in the isolated country homes as well as in the big cities of our country. I for one am thankful for the feelings that are stirred in hearts at this time of the year that seem to be dormant in so many hearts at other times. Feelings of love and concern, feelings of getting in touch with those whom we haven't had time for the rest of the year; feelings that bring families and friends closer together. I know we sometimes get so caught up in preparations, parties, gift-buying, cooking and such that we are too busy, frustrated and tired to really enjoy it all. But I think it is entirely possible for us as Christians to light up on the inside with the joy, light and radiance of Christ as we participate in moderation in the artificial lighting of the season that that kind of light will shine out to the darkened world around us. Jesus is the true light and God sent Him into this dark sin-cursed world to shed abroad that light to whosoever will. And He told us that we are the light of the world. If He lives within He will shine out through us to those in darkness.

Bro. Marcus Adair brought such a good illustration of lights when he recently spoke at AFBC. He was flying at night with instruments. It was a very dark night with no stars in sight. He saw the lights of several airports as he passed over and his instruments told him he was exactly on course, but when by his instruments he was supposed to be over Gage, Oklahoma and come in for his landing there were no lights in sight. He checked and rechecked the readings on his instruments and everything checked out that he was on target, but where were the lights? Fear gripped his heart as he radiod ahead to Gage and told them of his position and inquired why he couldn't see the lights. They replied that because of the

energy crisis the runway lights were turned off, but if he would hold on a second they would turn them on. He made a believer of me when he said that lights have never looked so good or so bright to him as that night when in the nick of time the runways were suddenly ablaze and he could see to land safely. How often have I been going down a dark, dark runway asking "Lord, where are the lights? It's so very dark, and I can't see anything and I don't know which way to turn." Never but never has He failed to turn the lights on in time to give me a safe landing. The very next day after Bro. Adair's sermon something totally unexpected happened that turned on some runway lights for me. I told my husband that I knelt in prayer after the incident, and cried "Thank you, Lord, Thank you Lord, for turning on those lights when I needed them so desperately." Isn't it great to have the source of all light as our Lord and Master? We need never fear a power shortage or an energy crisis with Him on our side. He'll be the only light in the new heaven and new earth. We may have to curtail some of our usual outside Christmas lights because of our current energy crisis; but not so with the inward light that Christ can turn on in our hearts. It can shine even brighter than ever and in the dark world we're in today we should make a conscious effort to see that it does. Our only concern should be, "Have we kept the connection pure, clean and in tact between us and the powerhouse.

I have always loved Isaiah 9:2 and never fail to read it several times during the Christmas season.

"The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light: They that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined." Thank God for that Light! Let Jesus the light of the World, turn of in your heart this season.

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Sometimes it's hard to receive

THE DOORBELL RINGS. You peek through the window—and there stands a neighbor holding a colorfully wrapped Christmas gift.

Nothing wrong with that—except you haven't bought a gift for them!

You try to think of something in those few seconds it takes to get the door opened. But all you can think of is, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

And you're receiving.

It's easy to be gracious when you're giving. It presents an opportunity to show your bigheartedness, your concern, your love. People get caught up in the spirit of the season and enjoy giving. It makes them feel so good to know they have done something nice for someone else.

But receiving—that means taking a secondary position. It means you recognize the giver in at least a slightly superior role. It tends to make you feel obligated. You may feel at a disadvantage and have to swallow your pride. Even adults sometimes look at receiving the way a child looks on hand-medowns.

Can you accept a Christmas gift graciously if you have none to give in return? Or do you lamely suggest, "I'm sorry, but we haven't gotten something for you yet"—as you try to get out of the role of receiving.

Perhaps you face the same embarrassment when you receive a Christmas card from someone you didn't send one to this year. You scurry to see if you have any leftover cards—because you don't want those friends or acquaintances to be offended.

Of course, you wouldn't feel that way if you were the one who was giving. You wouldn't think anything about it if you took a gift to your neighbors and they were unable to do something in return.

Perhaps you sent a Christmas card to a casual acquaintance because you wanted to share the joy

of Christmas. It wouldn't bother you at all if they didn't send a card in return.

It wouldn't bother you—because you are giving—and it is more blessed to give than to receive.

But there are times when you need to receive. Christmas is one of those times.

But there's an even more important one. The Bible says, "But as many as *received* him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name" (John 1:12).

When it comes to eternal salvation, God offers it to you as a free gift. You cannot buy it or earn it or deserve it. You must simply accept it—receive it.

When you recognize that you are a sinner and cannot save yourself, in that moment you see that God is offering you something you cannot possibly get in any other way. You are aware of your own inadequacy—and His supremacy. You may have to swallow your pride. You may even be embarrassed to admit you are a sinner and need His salvation.

But the Heavenly Father stands reaching toward you with His gift: "The gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23).

When you admit your need and reach out to receive His gift, His peace calms the struggle in your soul and you have peace—the peace that Christmas is all about.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

You can have the joy of sins forgiven, the joy of a brand-new start, the joy of fellowship with your Creator. You can have the joy of receiving a gift beyond price when you take Jesus as your Saviour and Lord.

What can you give in return? Any gift you give could never match His gift. But you can give Him yourself—and that's what He has always wanted.

EVANGELISM 1974 By Sharolyn Cox, Kingman, Kans.

JOY

"For none of us liveth to Himself, and no man dieth to himself." (Romans 14:7) We are not our own. This is a fact that is hard and carries unpopular favor. The trend of today and perhaps in history can be summed up in one word. "Selfish". We may not be selfish with material possessions but when it comes to actions, words, or deeds we're quick to defend what we think is our right "to do our own thing" no matter what the consequences to God, other, or ourselves. When it came to facing re-

ality, though, Paul knew what he was talking about when he said we neither live or die to ourselves. No matter what we do or say will have an effect on the lives of others. We're responsible to Jesus, Others, and Ourselves

What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's. (I Cor. 6:19, 20) Jesus paid the ultimate price because of love so that we could experience a close spiritual relationship with our Lord. He was the supreme example in all situations. He gave His all willingly that we might have eternal life. His heart was broken for us. "Greater love hath no man than this, that He lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13) Sometimes the attitude is taken that responsibilities are drudgery and only carried out because of their necessity or because they are required of us. But our responsibilities to God are privileges when realized through the light of God's divine love. It's a privilege to walk in His footsteps, to be near Him, and feel His great love. When we walk Christ-like we're shouldering our end of those responsibilities because we're sharing in all parts of Jesus'

The Christian's responsibilities are meted out according to his own indivdual walk with the Lord. Those that have much, much is required: Those that have little, little is required. I remember the account of the three servants who were given talents: One five, another two, and yet another, one according to their worth or ability. The two servants with the five and two talents used their talents and received more talents to go with them. But the servant with one talent was afraid and hid his talent. It was taken from him. Even though this parable referred to money, I like to apply it to the talents that God placed in me. What the Lord has given us He wants us to use to glorify Himself. If we don't use our talents, they will be taken from us. Although in man's eyes we may be a failure, I praise the Lord that he looks at the intents of the heart. After all It's God that we're accountable too. He wants us to serve, love and please Him. It's our privilege to feast our eyes in His beauty and glory, but so many times they shift to the level of man.

Paul in Romans 12:1, 2 states, "I beseech ye therefore brethren by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, and acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." This verse really speaks to me. First, God requires a living sacrifice. That certanly doesn't mean living a deadhead or one who continually insists on dying for the Lord. The Lord can't use a dead man. We're responsible, for as Paul said, "I die daily," to self. We must present ourselves humbly, submissively, and yielded to be usable to God. Sometimes it's hard to sacrifice our wilfulness for God's will. Second we're to be "holy and acceptable unto God." We're the temple of the Lord. For him to dwell in us we must be cleansed within and without; spotless, unmarred by the world. But the third part of this verse humbles me. All we can do is just reasonably well. It's our reasonable service. God is so great and wonderful but yet he chose mere humans to be his own. We were made to love Him because of our choice and not because we had to. Love is another responsibility included in the countless number of requirements made by God. The greatest commandment tells us to love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, soul, and mind. Nothing that he requires of us is too much. Before he asked anything of us he gave it to us in the beginning. We're not self sufficient. We love Him because He gave us His love first. He paved the way before us. Whatever he requires at our hand, He has already tested on Himself. His strength is in our weakness. He can accomplish His purpose in our lives, but it's our decision and then our responsibility to keep in tune with Him determining to be His disciples.

And the second (commandment) is like unto it. Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. If we love someone we care what happens to them. We feel responsible for our earthly family. So should it be with our spiritual family. Cain, after slaying Abel, asked God if he was his brothers keeper. We definitely are. When one member of our physical body hurts all of the other members try to ease the pain. So it is spiritually. If we see a brother or sister in Christ in need, we are responsble for helping share that burden or need. We're to encourage, uplft. and be an example. We must let our lights so shine before men that they may see our good works and glorify our Father which is in Heaven. Where there is a need we're to stand in the gap and help in whatever way we can. The need may be for prayer, or to share our material possessions, or encouragement. In any case, we must be "prayed up:" Instant in season and out of season making full proof of your ministry. If we have to "pray through" in our own lives before we can minister to someone in need, the Lord can't really use us. That need is immediate and can't wait for us to get where we can help them. You can't pour anything but air from an empty vessel. We must keep a fresh abundant supply of the oil of the Holy Spirit in our vessel to be used and anointed of God. We're responsible for what we say and how we act. Others doesn't just mean our Christian brethren. We're to love our enemies, turn the other cheek, and bless them that persecute us. To some people our lives may be the only Bible they read. We're responsible for portraying Christ in truth, reality, and love. Our conversation and actions must be above reproach else we become a stumbling block to the Christian and add darkness to the sin-

Before we can love others we must love ourself. The Bible says to love our neighbor as ourself. To know how to love our neighbor we must know how to love ourself. It's not selfish to love yourself because we love the Jesus that is in us. We're responsible to walk righteously, honestly as in the day. Not in rioting and drunkenness, chambering and wantoness: not in strife and enying. We're responsible for keeping our all on the altar; to live a consecrated and dedicated life clean and holy before God.

All in all it is a merry-go-round. You can't live a completed life in Jesus or be Christlike without accepting the responsibilities to Jesus, Others and Yourself. Acceptance of these major factors makes the minor details just all fall in place. And it all spells Joy. He is made strong in our weakness and the JOY of the Lord is our strength. Praise the Lord!

SEED OF LOT
Today?

What was once an old Testament nation and a powerful economy, with powerful urban centers, seems crumbled and smashed beyond recognition by intervening centuries.

-But the Word of God promises a recall. The almighty and everlasting God has regathered the nation of Israel out of 1,900 years of total dispersion. Out of the scattered fragments, once more there is a separate nation, identified clearly among the nations of the earth.

Ezekiel 34:11, 12, 13—For thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I, even I, will both search my sheep, and seek them out.

As a shepherd seeketh out his flock in the day that he is among his sheep that are scattered: So will I seek out my sheep, and will deliver them out of all places where they have been scattered in the cloudy and dark day.

And I will bring them out from the people, and gather them from the countries, and will bring them upon the mountains of Israel by the rivers, and in all the inhabited places of the country.

What salient truth do these instances of revival or recall emphasize?

They emphasize the total ability of God to fashion out of what seems to be oblivian, each life, each personality, completely identifiable, that has passed from time.

Things are beginning to surface at the end time as God said they would and as scheduled in His Word.

This interesting emergence of an Old Testament people is one of the exciting things getting ready to happen. No wonder the Master commanded, "Watch!" (Mark 13:37) No one can possibly doubt if he will pay close attention to transpiring events.

God's prophecy to Rebekah is being consummated in our time. The Lord's words to Isaac's wife are among the most interesting and far-reaching in all scripture. Genesis 25: we read where Isaac appealed to the Lord on behalf of his wife because she was barren; the Lord yielded to his entreaty, and Rececca conceived. The children pressed hard on each other in her womb, and she said, "If this is how it is with me, what does it mean? So she went to seek guidance of the Lord. The Lord said to her:

Two nations in your womb, two peoples, going their own ways from birth! One shall be stronger than the other; the older shall be servant to the younger!

The baby twins were named Esau and Jacob.

Gen. 27—we see where Esau hated Jacob and wanted to kill him. And the hatred remains today, yes, there are "two manner of people"—separated (Gen. 25:-23).

This is what is making front page news, and will continue to write history.

The spotlight is turning toward the Middle East. That can mean only one thing. (Luke 21:24) "and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled." God is again turning toward Abraham's seed, and Lots seed. Its a tragedy when a professing member of the Body of Christ can't read the "Signs of the Times."

Matt. 16:3 . . . "Jesus said, ye can discern the face of the sky; but can ye not discern the Signs of the Times?"

ABRAHAM'S NEPHEW LOT

What were the promises to Lots seed? How and when will they be fulfilled? Questions we ask are answered in truths from the Bible and the Bible characters we study. (I Corinthians 10:11) "Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come."

The story of Lot from the book of Genesis, centuries passed before the true estimate of Lot was rendered and revealed. It must have afforded Peter some degree of personal comfort to have been chosen the recipient by the Holy Spirit of this revelation and eternal summary of life chronicled in the first book of the Bible.

II Peter 2:6, 7, 8, and 9—And turning the cities of Sodom and Gomarrha into ashes condemned them with an overthrow, making them an ensample unto those that after should live ungodly;

And delivered just Lot, vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked:

(For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, vexed his righteous soul from day to day with their unlawful deeds;)

The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations, and to reserve the unjust unto the day of judgment to be punished:

I Samuel 16:7 . . . "For the Lord seeth not as man seeth: for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart."

How did Lot's life—his failures and his successes effect history? (Romans 14:7) For none of us liveth to himself, and no man dieth to himself.

Paul speaks about this to Timothy (I Timothy 5:24,-25) Some men's sins are open beforehand, going before to judgment; and some men they follow after.

Likewise also the good work of some are manifest beforehand; and they that are otherwise cannot be hid.

How far-reaching is the life of Lot?

The answer is that it reaches into our time and plays an important role at the close of the age: (Jeremiah 48:-47) "Yet will I bring again the captivity of Moab in the latter days, saith the Lord . . .

So what has happened since the said circumstances reported in the 19th chapter of Genesis? In uncircumspect and questionable circumstances the birth of Moab is reported.

(Genesis 19:37, 38) And the firsthorn bare a son, and called his name Moab: the same is the father of the Moabites unto this day.

And the younger, she also bare a son, and called his name Benammi: the same is the father of the children of Ammon unto this day.

Other nations are again moving to the forefront. Front Page News might be bewildering were it not for the prophetic accuracy of the Word of God. As we see detail upon detail coming to pass, it becomes proof abundant that the return of Christ is very, very soon.

GOD HAS SET FOURTH A SCHEDULE IN HIS WORD. (Amos 3:7) Surely the Lord God will do nothing, but He revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets. "It has all been told in advance."

The first born son of Lot, Moab, occupied the then fertile plains east of the Dead Sea, the territory being divided into two portions by the River Arnon. The Capitol City was built along this river.

The next born son of Lot, Benammi or the Ammon's, they were just to the north along the Jordan River.

To the West of the Dead Sea we find Jerusalem, Hebron and Beersheba which Israel now dwell in.

God assigned this territory to the Moabites. Moses was told before the Canaan invasion not to disturb them.

(Deuteronomy 2:9) And the Lord said unto me, Distress not the Moabites, neither contend with them in battle: for I will not give thee of their land for a possession; because I have given Ar unto the children of Lot for a possession.

God also said the same thing about the Ammonites. This is a mandate that faces modern Israel today.

Watch closely as you observe the power struggle between Isaac and Ishmael—between Jew and Arab! There are forbidden sectors to Israel. They have been given by God to other people.

Which people is "stronger than the other"? Wherein lies this strength?

To Jacob's family was given the strength of the Law of Moses. The Bible is stronger than the Koran, and to Jacob was given the strength of the Messiah.

But Esau's family was given the strength of numbers. In him has been found the strength of earth's most primary industrial need—OIL.

Look back on Rebekah's pains—"the children struggled together within her." (Gen. 25:22) She was the first to ask, "Why"?

The struggle is unresolved, still we are asking "Why"?

The twins' strengths have competed and jostled each other since birth.

(Gen. 25:28) "Isaac loved Esau,—but Rebekah loved Jacob."

The Moabites were Idotaters, their chief idol was Chemosh or Baal-Peor.

(Jeremiah 48:7) He knew the existence of this idolgod. The worship was vile and vulgar. The narrative in II Kings 3:26,27—provides us with this.

They indulged in human sacrifices, the cup of their iniquity ran full. (Amos 2:1-3) He speaks of this. Jeremiah was revolted at the practice of human sacrifice. (Jeremiah 19:5).

FOES OF ISRAEL

In spite of common blood, the Ammonite and Moabites were bitter foes of Israel. This brought God's verdict: (Deuteronomy 23:3-6) "An Ammonite or Moabite shall not enter into the congregation of the Lord; even to their tenth generation shall they not enter into the congregation of the Lord for ever:

Because they met you not with bread and with water in the way, when ye came forth out of Egypt; and because they hired against thee Balaam the son of Beor of Pethor of Mesopotamia, to curse thee.

Nevertheless the Lord thy God would not harken unto Balaam; but the Lord thy God turned the curse into a blessing unto thee, because the Lord thy God loved thee.

Thou shalt not seek their peace nor their prosperity all thy days for ever.

The Moabites had sought to destroy Israel by compromise and intermingling. Balaam suggested that they bring down God's curse upon Israel indirectly. So they decided to seduce Israel's manhood by their beautiful women. It cost Israel the deaths of 24,000 men. Moses tells the story in the book of Numbers, 25. (John the Revelater 2:14) reminds us that this nefarious attempt of hell is always trying to compromise Christ's witness upon earth.

This is the path of compromise about which Paul warns the Corinthians. (II Corinthians 6:14-18) Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?

And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel?

And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? For ye are the temple of the living God: as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.

Time after time Moab, united with every possible ally to crush Israel. (Psalm 83:6-8) remembers the ones that had tried to help the children of Lot against Israel.

(I Cronicles 18:2, 3) also (II Kings 3:4). David reduced them to tribute and a high price it was.

MOAB'S PRIDE

The pride of Lot, who "sat in the gate of Sodom". (Genesis 19:1) marks his descendants, the Moabites. (Isaiah 16:6, 7) We have heard of the pride of Moab; he is very proud: even of his haughtiness, and his pride, and his wrath: but his lies shall not be so. Therefore shall Moab howl for Moab. . . .

This strain is proud of their Semetic origin, in spite of its questionable beginning. The race is proud of its lands and valour with which they have defended the territory. It has become legendary.

What happened to the descendants of Moah? God noted their beastly idolatry. God noted their arrogance. These must at length bring judgment. There is a rule which says, (Proverbs 16-18) Pride goeth before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall. Nowhere is this better illustrated than in the history of Moab.

Like Lot who staggered through the warnings sent to Sodom and Gomorrah, so Moab refused to listen. Isaiah reviews that history in chapters fifteen and sixteen. They are poignant with grief and collapse. He tells of Moab's doom. (Isaiah 16:14) But now the Lord hath spoken, saying, within three years, as the years of a hireling, and the glory of Moab shall be condemned, with all that great multitude; and the remnant shall be very small and feeble.

Ezekiel amplifies their national tragedy. Chapter 25:8-10. (Ezekiel 25:11) And I will execute judgments upon Moab; and they shall know that I am the Lord.

Amos confirms it (2:2) But I will send a fire upon Moab, and it shall devour the palaces of Kirioth: and Moab shall die with tumult, with shouting, and with the sound of the trumpet.

Zephaniah was instructed to declare: (2:9-10) Therefore, as I live, saith the Lord of Hosts, the God of Israel. surely Moab shall be as Sodom, and the children of Ammon as Gomorrah, even the breeding of nettles, and saltpits, and a perpetual desolation: the residue of my people shall spoil them, and the remnant of my people shall possess them. This shall they have for their pride.

MOAB'S FUTURE

Where are they now?

These prophecies have been literally fulfilled. Today it is impossible to distinguish Moabite from Arab. The once fertile land is an arid spectre of gloom.

Has God forgotten? Has God reneged? The promise of Deuteronomy 2:9 is a contract. "And the Lord said unto me, Distress not the Moabites, neither contend with them in battle: for I will not give thee their land for a possession; because I have given Ar unto the children of Lot for a possession."

Isaiah reminds us that a remnant was spared out of their national disaster. Though it was to be very small and feeble yet it would be a separate existence. (16-14).

Then comes the word of Jeremiah, "Yet will I bring again the captivity of Moab in the latter days." (48:47). That miracle must be fulfilled! It will be an eye-opener. Twenty-seven hundred years of dispersion have accumulated. How can God find them and shape them again into a people. It seems a more difficult miracle to perform than the salvage of Israel.

Still as the curse has been fulfilled to the very letter, faith is satisfied that the restoration of Moab will as surely come when the moment of fulfillment strikes.

The seed of Lot is somewhere. It is not lost. God knows where it is, and He knows how to set it forth.

Once it was a great and proud nation. What does God intend it to be in the end time? It will be His witness.

Strange things are happening. Soon the Antichrist will be revealed.

(Daniel 11:41) reveals a startling turn of events. "He shall enter also into the glorious land, and many countries shall be overthrown: but these shall escape out of his hand, even Edom, and Moab, and the chief of the children of Ammon."

There is a part of modern-day Araby that will succumb to the Man of Sin. It is an "escape" that has startling ramifications.

It indicates again what Nebuchadnezzar learned that (Daniel 4:35, 37) "all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: and He doeth according to His Will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay His hand or say unto Him, what doest thou? — and those that walk in pride He is able to abase."

When you check the thirty-eighth chapter of Ezekiel and see the many allied forces named of the one with evil intent, coming against the Holy Land. The Moabites are not mentioned.

This is a strange turn of events. Once Moab joined every available ally opposed to Israel and God's plan of redemption. In (Jeremiah 48:47) yet will I bring again the captivity of Moab in "The Latter Days", saith the Lord. Moab will resist the threat to Israel.

Will God reward their fidelity, when the whole of Christendom is in revolt against divine authority and slavishly worshiping Antichrist?

Will Abraham and Lot be reunited? It is an intriguing thought.

Do you think the cleft will be closed. The enmity between blood-ties will cease.

It takes us back to Ruth, the Moabitess. She played her part in the line of our Lord. (Ruth 4:13). So Boaz took Ruth and she was his wife. (Ruth 4:21-22) and Salmon begat Boaz, and Boaz begat Obed, and Obed begat Jesse and Jesse begat David. You may not have known this, but it's all right there.

In thinking of God's promises to the Jewish people we have forgotten His promises to their enemies.

These centuries-old enemies must cease some day. There is always that, "remnant."

It is also interesting to remember that when you study the second chapter of Acts, among those reported hearing at Pentecost were "Arabeans" (Acts 2:11). Who can tell but that among them were some of Lot's seed?

Watch for this mighty work of God! Blended as they now are with Midianites, Ishmaelites, and other Arab races, we cannot separate Isaiah's (16:14) "Remnant of Moab" from the mass of Arabs. But God has His eye upon them. He can regather them and identify them as easily as He has assembled the seed of Jacob in our time. His unimpeachable word declares, "yet will I bring

again the captivity of Moab in the latter days." (Jeremiah 48:47).

About Jacob and Eau (Genesis 27:39, 40) and Isaac his father answered and said unto him, Behold, thy dwelling shall be the fatness of the earth, and of the dew of heaven from above; and by thy sword shall thou live, and shalt serve thy brother: and it shall come to pass when thou shalt have the dominion, that thou shalt break his yoke from off thy neck.

By noting a few key phrases you can readily see how this ancient prophecy is at last fulfilled to the letter.

"Fatness of the earth" — this speaks of wealthy resources. What nations have greater wealth today than the descendants of Esau?

"By thy sword shalt thou live." — this speaks of the warlike pasture of the Arab nations. These children of Esau are bent on exerting their will by force of Arms.

"Thou shalt have the dominion" — this speaks of the descendants of Esau gaining greater influence in world politics than the descendants of Jacob. And in 1974 this has taken place. Never before in history has this been so. By twisting the "oil spigot", the Arabs now hold the dominion.

"Thou shalt not break his yoke from off thy neck"

— Jacob no longer tells Esau what to do. The Arab nations are now "calling the shots" in Mideast Politics.

This is evident. All the nations which are connected with Abraham, either by blood or by kindred origin are gradually coming to the front as the Dispensation of Grace moves toward a close.

TIME TO WATCH

So many things are tied into the restoration of Israel and the return of Christ.

What glorious futures so many facets of history will share when these age-long disturbances are solved!

Everything points to the One Man — Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

(Rev. 11:15) — "The Kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christs; and He shall reign for ever and ever."

There is a lot to "Watch." (Mark 13:37) "And what I say unto you I say unto all, WATCH."

(I John 5:13) "These things have I written unto you that believe."

God takes infinite precaution that faith exercised will never be misplaced. (Joal 2:26) "My people shall never be ashamed."


