First Reading
Dt 4:1-2, 6-8
[Observing God's Law]

Meditating on the Law of Moses, the author of Deuteronomy saw the danger of human traditions, usually created by pious and well-intentioned churchmen, which could obscure the original will of God for his people. In your observance of the commandments of the Lord, "you shall not add to what I command you nor subtract from it."

From the Gospel we learn that the Pharisees and experts of the law in Jesus' time had not heeded this advice of Deuteronomy too well. The Responsorial Psalm mentions a few things that cannot be done away with.

Jas 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27
[Act on God's Word]

The sacred author stresses that the word of God is a genuine benefit from above, freely given by God. If this word is humbly welcomed in faith, it will save us. But we should do more than just listen to God's word. We should also live it.

Theme: The Human and the Divine Element in Religion


On leaving the safe family setting and going to college, many young intellectuals begin to have doubts about their religion. An agnostic professor may make a sneering remark about "The Good Book"; fellow students, though ostensibly Catholics, may show by their behavior that they could not care less about religion. Although there are many reasons for such confusion in young minds, one may be that many do not make a distinction between what is God-made and what is human in religion, especially as we used to live it in the Catholic tradition.

Basic Christianity is a beautiful way of life, but many object to the way it has been institutionalized over the centuries. Many human-made details were added and some of them are/were undoubtedly outdated. The renewal movement begun by the Second Vatican Council aims at divesting the Church of human baggage picked up along its journey through history. Naturally, this requires sound and informed leadership in order not to "throw out the baby with the bath water," in other words, in the process of cleaning not to do away with divine elements.

As the saying goes: "Pope John wanted to open the windows to let in fresh air, not to throw out the furniture!" Young and old should update themselves. If programs are available take part in them, or ask your parish council to take constructive initiatives.
