Presbytery Meeting April 12, 2016

Dear Church family,

Let me begin by saying a heartfelt "Thank you" to each and every one of you who came to the meeting to support us. No words that we could have spoken from the lectern would have conveyed the unity and spirit of our Church family more clearly than your presence.

The following is a summary of the meeting and its outcome:

After reports from the Presbytery Task Force Team and our Discernment Team, the floor was opened to questions concerning the presentations and the terms of the agreement. Several members of the Presbytery, while expressing sadness at our anticipated departure, also conveyed their understanding as to why we felt it was necessary for us to leave. It was further expressed and acknowledged that the differences and reasons for separation were as a result of the General Assembly's actions and not those of the San Diego Presbytery.

There were 3 people who spoke against the motion for us to be released. One individual referenced a court case (Tom vs. the Presbytery of San Francisco) and commented that the process of Gracious Dismissal did not provide for a 90 day period of time for those who opposed the action to file remedial complaints. That comment was addressed by the Lead from the Presbytery's Task Force Team assigned to us.

The essence of the comments from the 3 people who spoke against the terms of our dismissal

focused on the opinion that the financial settlement was inadequate. This comment was addressed by the Presbytery's Task Force Team member who handled the financial settlement negotiations with us. Another individual opposing the settlement issue also added that he felt that the 5 year reversionary clause was too short and should be increased to 10 years.

Comments having been heard from both sides, the motion for the vote to dismiss us according to the terms of the agreement as written was called with the results as follows:

The motion was carried and we were dismissed with "Thanks".

Following the conclusion of the meeting, several members of the Presbytery approached us to extend their good wishes to us as we move forward.

Worship Leader Job Description

Scope of Responsibilities:

- Lead our 1st. Worship Service (Contemporary) at 9 a.m.
- Be a resource to the Worship Team; in properly leading them in Worship.

General Responsibilities:

- Build the Worship Team
- Rehearse the Worship Team
- Be present to lead 1st Service in Worship each Sunday morning (except for planned vacations)
- Worship Leader will need to find a replacement in advance whenever absent.

Reporting Relationship:

Reports directly to the Pastor.
 Reports to the Session through the Worship Team Elder.

Selection and Tenure:

 Will be evaluated through the yearly interview process by the Personnel Team.

Specific Responsibilities:

- The Worship Leader is to plan, facilitate and conduct music for the 9 a.m. Worship Service. This includes music for pre-worship through songs, offering and post-worship.
- Sufficient rehearsal is expected to assure optimum worship effectiveness.
- The Worship Leader is responsible to lead the congregation in worship, lead the worship/praise team, and accompany soloists.
- The worship Leader is expected to help plan and lead in periodic special worship services.
- Worship Leader is responsible for musical set up and strike for each 9 a.m. Worship Service. They are responsible for construction and arrangement of slides for worship and administration of slides to screen on Sunday morning..
- Worship Leader is responsible for lowering the screen prior to worship and raising it after worship.
- All equipment is to be properly stored and put away after rehearsals and worship.
- Worship Leader is responsible for selecting and teaching new worship songs to the congregation.

- While not required to attend monthly Worship Ministry Team meetings, the Worship Leader is welcome, if so desired. Necessary communication to the Worship Ministry Team can be facilitated through the Minister of Music.
- This is a part time position of 10 hours a week.
- Performance review will be conducted annually by the Minister of Music in written form which will be submitted to Pastor and Personnel Committee.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES DIRECTOR JOB DESCRIPTION

Scope of Responsibilities:

- Supervise and maintain the Sunday School Program including Toddlers (2 and 3 year old,) Pre-School, 1st. through 5th grade.
- Plan for and maintain Children's Church Program.
- Act as a resource person for guidance, preparation for the Kids Kingdom Program.
- Serve as liaison person for Kid's Kingdom staff and the Christian Education Team.
 Kids Kingdom takes place on Wednesday afternoon/evening from the end of September to the week before Easter. The program includes homework help, snacks, free play, Bible Study, games, crafts, music and dinner.
- Organize a Teacher Appreciation Day for Sunday School Teachers, VBS, special events like Easter, Christmas, Super Bowl of Caring or other duties that pastor will ask for.
- Organize the Bibles to be given to all third grade students in the fall.

- Speak during chapel at Trinity Christian School on Fridays when needed. (usually in January before Super Bowl of Caring, and possibly in September about Kids Kingdom.)
- Attend Children's Pastor Conferences when applicable. This is most important during the first year to obtain ideas to make the ministry meaningful and fun for the children.

<u>General Responsibilities:</u> The Children's Ministries Director will be expected to

- 1. Devote twenty (20) hours per week to the various assigned responsibilities.
- 2. Identify and anticipate potential problems so preventive actions can be planned.
- 3. Model as a strong Christian walk, and the educational principles adopted by this church
- 4. Oversee the Nursery Program.

In essence, the Children's Ministries Director has the overall responsibility for planning, organizing, staffing, directing and evaluation of the Children's Sunday School Program to ensure the effective Bible and Christian concepts are taught in each area of Children's ministries.

Reporting Relationship: Reports directly to the Pastor. Reports to Session through the Christian Education Team Elder.

<u>Selection and Tenure:</u> Will be accomplished through the yearly interview process by the Personnel Committee. Annual reviews are given by the Personnel Committee.

Specific Responsibilities: The Children's Ministries Director shall.....

- Be present each Sunday morning (except for planned vacations) to coordinate, observe and evaluate the Sunday School Program. This should include:
 - Quarterly observing at least one class in each department, to note problems and/or improvements.

- Recording observed needs, problems and improvements to discuss with the appropriate person/groups.
- Giving affirmation and support to the staff.
- 2. Meet at least once a month with the Christian Education Team to:
 - Program of the Sunday
 School and the development
 and maintenance of an
 organizational plan that
 supports your
 teaching/learning philosophy.
 - Select and implement curriculum for the Sunday School.
 - Set goals for the Sunday School year and evaluate progress toward these goals.
 - Recruit teachers and leaders for the Sunday School program with the Supervision and assistance of the Christian Education Team.
 - Develop training for new teachers as well as in-service training for current staff.
 - Review and expand the outreach ministry of the Sunday School; Implement a program to follow-up for families that are new to the Sunday School.
 - Review facility and equipment needs, taking whatever corrective action is required.

- Determine and secure needed resources, both financial and physical.
- Solve problems.
- 3. Function as the primary channel of communication between the Sunday School staff, Pastor and Session.
 - Meet weekly with the pastor attend Church Staff meetings, and monthly Christian Education Team meetings.
 - Represent the Sunday School on Church Staff and the Christian Education Team so that the Sunday School ministry can be coordinated with the ministries of other church agencies to develop a well-balanced program of Christian Education.
 - Communicate, policies, procedures and changes to the Sunday School staff.
 - Preparing, with the assistance of the treasurer, an annual budget request. File quarterly reports of expenditures and submit these to the Christian Education Team.
 - Review yearly statistical report on enrollment, attendance and contract and submitting these to the Session through the Christian Education Elder.
 - Clear proposed dates of Sunday School activities with the Church Secretary for the master calendar of the church.

• Keep schedule of nursery workers and handle any problems that arise.

You will witness a **Salud y VidaFamily Health Clinic** in progress by a volunteer staff of health workers directed by **Nurse Martha Gonzales Rojas.**

And you will inspect the foundation and slab of the church's Multipurpose Building – the first phase start of "*Rosarito Rising!*"
