After a long and courageous battle with cancer Pepsi collector, Tom Avery passed away November 4, 1989.

It is in his memory that we dedicate this issue of the PCCC Newsletter.

I've known Tom almost as long as I've collected Pepsi memorabilia. We were friends and competitors, we drank Pepsi together and swapped stories about the Pepsi piece that got away. If you wanted to sit around for hours discussing the history of Pepsi, nuances of Pepsi logos, Tom was your man.

Like most collectors who knew Tom I had heard of him before I ever met him. In fact, it seems like every antique store I went to Tom had been there first. Then finally in 1980 at the Disneyland Antique Advertising Show I met Tom. From that meeting he became my mentor guiding and teaching me the fine art of Pepsi collecting.

Tom was a pioneer in Pepsi collecting and will be greatly missed.

COLLECTOR SPOTLIGHT

We are taking this occasion to remember Tom by re-running his Collectors Spotlight article.

Like most Pepsi-Cola Collectors, Tom Avery is a "Pepsiholic". He started collecting Pepsi-Cola items on July 29th, 1974 with an early 50's thermometor, a gift from a friend. This started him collecting small Pepsi collectibles. wasn't until late fall of 1975 that Tom met a serious collector of the other product that started him collecting in a serious way. And now just over 10 years later, Tom has put together one of the largest collections in the country.

Some of the special items in his collection are a 1903 Miss Pepsi Fountain Sign, (only one known), a 1903 fountain syrup dispenser, a 1903 tip tray (3 known), a 1907 tip tray, 1908 tip tray, 1909 tip tray, 1910 tip tray, 1908 tin sign (2 known), a 1909 straw holder, 1908 serving tray, 1909 serving tray, 1909 calendar, 1910 calender, 1919 lithograph, 1931 pinch bottle sign, over 135 embossed bottles (dating from 1907 to 1931). Tom has (3) 1906 to 1910 redemption coupons, 7 ads dated 1902 to 1903 from the New Bern paper.

In Tom's extensive collection there are many pieces with a special story or meaning behind them. One particular piece has a very special meaning. It's a 1978 North Carolina personalized license plate with the letters "PEPSI C". It is from the late "Everette Lloyd Collection".

CATCH THAT PEPSI SPIRIT

To celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the introduction of Pepsi and Pete the Pepsi-Cola Cops, we are re-running this article from a previous newsletter.

On October 4, 1939 the Pepsi-Cola Company introduced a couple of jovial cops somewhat reminscent of Mark Sennetts keystone cops, to readers in 712 newspapers across the country. The cartoon strip was called, "Pepsi and Pete".. The Pepsi-Cola Cops.

The introduction of the Pepsi-Cola Cops marked a noticeable change in the emphasis of Pepsi-Cola advertising, previously all advertisment was built around price, now humor was to become an additional vehicle to sell Pepsi-Cola.

The idea for a Pepsi-Cola comic strip was thought up by Walter Mack, then President of the Pepsi-Cola Company, who wanted to use Popeye for the cartoon strip. The idea was to replace spinach with Pepsi-Unfortunately the Cola. Company who owned the rights to Popeye wanted more money for him than Pepsi-Cola could afford to pay at that time. At this point Walter Mack decided to use the Pepsi-Cola Cops. When I asked Mr. Mack if he had any regrets in not purchasing Popeye he said, "No, because the Pepsi-Cola Cops had accomplished what we wanted them to do." Some felt the key to success of the Peosi-Cola Cops comic strip was Walter Mack's insistence that while selling the product the comic strip should be funny. Mr. Mack's theory must have been right, the comic strip ran for eleven years from October 1939 until sometime in 1950.

During their eleven year run the small cop and the large cop alternated using the names of Pepsi and Pete, due possibly to the fact that several different artists drew the comic strip.


In their initial appearance Pepsi and Pete revealed the roles they were to play. One puts a tape measure around the bottle and declares, "I make sure you get a big, big bottle — 12 full ounces." His companion is shown in the act of sampling the product and saying "I make sure it's wholesome and grand tasting."

In addition to the comic strip in the Sunday newspaper, the Pepsi-Cola Cops also appeared

in various magazines. During 1940 the Pepsi-Cola Cops appeared in "Look" magazine, they were used in half page ads using the format of the ad below. Besides the print median the Pepsi-Cola Cops were used on tin signs, cardboard stand-ups, matchbook covers, paper cups and drinking glasses. There maybe other novelty items that the Pepsi-Cola Cops appeared on, if you know of any please let us know.

The above ad came from "Look" magazine, February 1947. It was a half page ad printed in two colors.


The comic strip came from the comic section of a 1947 Sunday newspaper, the comic strip was printed in color.
