### G. 2023 LBCTA Scholarship

I am pleased to announce that the association will once again be awarding two \$1,000 scholarships to graduating seniors who are children of CTA members. Please note the premiums for 1/1/23–8/31/23 are deducted in the payroll through June 30<sup>th</sup> (*8 months of premiums in a 6-month period*). In September, the remaining 4 months of premium are spread throughout the 9/1/23 – 12/31/23 payroll (*4 months of premiums in a 4-month period*).

### I. IRS Mileage Rate 2023

The IRS has announced the official standard mileage rates for 2023. The standard business mileage rate for transportation expenses paid or incurred as of January 1st, 2023 is 65.5 cents per mile. This is up 3 cents from the midyear increase for the second half of 2022.

### **III. Executive Vice President's Report—Karen Bloom**

- A. We are disappointed about the lack of a formal midterm week at the high school. Despite the fact that the majority of high schools are having one, our central administration did not support us in our request. Our students are now at a disadvantage, since they are competing with students from other districts who will be provided with this opportunity to practice and prepare for their IB/AP/SUPA and/or Regents exams. It seems they may reinstate it for next year, however, this years' students would have benefitted as well.

#### **B. APPR**

1. You should have received your form stating who your evaluators are.
2. Please take an active role in the observation process. Keep in mind that the Danielson framework that we use is based on best practice and observable measures. You should not see opinions from your evaluation team. Be sure to address issues in your post observation conferences.

## C. Health & Safety

1. The following items were discussed at the last Health & Safety Meeting:

**a) Capital Project Update:**

- (1) Lido/MS: Steam heating, boilers and partial AC replacement are at SED for approval; hoping work will be done this summer which should alleviate issues this complex has been having.
- (2) HS:Bathrooms project is at SED for approval & will hopefully be completed this summer.
- (3) Some other items being sent for approval: AC at West, gazebo and sidewalks at NIKE, sewer and storage building at Transportation and the HVAC system at the Public Library.

**b) New Plan:** In addition to these projects, the district is working on a larger scope plan, using the information provided from the strategic planning as well as input from building administrators. Some things such as more bathrooms at the MS and HS, outdoor learning spaces, playgrounds at West & East, Courtyards at the MS, turf fields, and possibly reconfiguring the HS cafeteria. There could be other enhancements brought to the table as well.

**c) Grants:** The district received a grant to do work in the HS Library, which should be done in the near future; a complete overhaul & remodel. They also received a grant for the lighting in both the MS and HS Auditoriums. The materials have been ordered and they are hoping to have everything completed in time for Spring Concerts!

**d) Delayed Opening Notifications:** We discussed the most recent flood issues we had and the district recognized that it could have been handled differently. There were many factors in play that led to the abundance of water in many communities. Unfortunately, many of our teachers and support staff got stuck, lost cars, and/or never made it to work due to these outstanding circumstances. We discussed the possibility of having weather watchers or flood spotters in a variety of areas in order to better communicate in the future, so that decisions can be made sooner and notifications can be sent out earlier.

**e) Student ID's:** Mr. Myers shared that all students should have an ID at this point and are using them to swipe into the library and cafeteria as well as into the building if they arrive after 8am. In addition, the scanners are being placed outside of bathrooms, so that students will need to swipe into them as well. Hopefully this will deter some of the negative behaviors we have seen from some students. A letter will be sent to parents explaining the new procedures that will be implemented for Semester 2.

**f) HS Classroom Shades:** We have a vendor, ACME window treatments, to provide shades for those rooms that do not have any. They came and took measurements, PO's have been processed and we are hoping that the shades will be installed in the next 2-3 weeks.

**g) Pest Control:** We have a company that comes and does monthly checks in each of our buildings. They are suggesting that we do exactly what we are doing. It seems that this year, the MS/Lido Complex and the HS have a larger number of mice than usual. We also asked that they check for extra openings to be patched up, to limit the access for them. It was encouraged to keep all food out of classrooms and to please keep reporting to custodial staff when you see rodents or find droppings in classrooms or other areas. In addition, Mr. Kramer was going to look into the use of Rodent Repelling Foam, to see if

it was allowed in schools. At East, there was a deliberate strategy to address the rodent issue. They believe they caught the majority of the rats over break, but there may be one large one left! Please let custodial staff know if you see droppings or the rat!

**h) Other items discussed:**

- (1) There was a discussion about the phones in classrooms, specifically at the HS, to see if maybe we should consider pricing out a new system for the future.
  - (2) Our Boces Rep reminded us that we have 4 safety drills to complete in the Spring. She also said there is a Virtual training coming up for Threat Assessment Teams and suggested that some people from LB attend the training.
  - (3) We also discussed proper procedures for lockdowns if a student is in the bathroom. They should remain there, close the stall and put their feet up.
  - (4) There was also a question about whether or not door decorating is permitted. Mr. Kramer reminded everyone that we cannot decorate doors and that it is a violation.
