## Gaming News

#### Nebraska Gambling Proposal

As promised, sponsors of a trio of proposals that would authorize casino gambling at horse racetracks in Nebraska have swiftly gone to the Nebraska Supreme Court to contest Secretary of State Bob Evnen's recent ruling disqualifying the issue from consideration by Nebraska voters in November, according to the Lincoln Journal Star. Lynne McNally, representing the sponsors of the successful petition drive that sought to place the issue on the ballot, said

the decision was "incorrect as a matter of law because each of the three initiatives meets the applicable requirements of the Nebraska Constitution as to form and procedure."

### **Chicago Mayor Seeks Gambling Operators**

According to the Chicago Tribune, Mayor Lori Lightfoot took the next step this summer in the push for a Chicago casino, putting out a request for gambling operators and real estate developers to submit plans about how they would build and run what is expected to be a gigantic betting parlor in the city. The request was the expected next step after Springfield lawmakers came through with the changes to the casino tax structure that

allowed a gambling hall in the city.

#### Indiana Eyes Online Casinos

The Indiana State Legislature could begin considering a measure that would legalize online casino gambling as early as next year. According to an August report from the news domain at PlayIndiana.com, State Senator Jon Ford explained that his office is working on language for a proposal that could see "The Hoosier State" introduce as many as 39 online casino licenses. Ford plans to present his iGaming legislation early next year, although the ongoing threat of coronavirus may ultimately delay this timeline.

#### **Drive-In Bingo**

Creative ways to cope with the Covid-19 pandemic are popping up everywhere. In Wakulla County, Florida, drive-in Bingo has proven very popular with the community. Sponsored by the Wakulla County Public Library, the idea came about as a spinoff of drive-in movies of long ago. About 20 cars filled with players of all ages pulled into the community center parking lot for the inaugural session. Library staff set up a loudspeaker, handed out Bingo sheets and began calling the numbers. Players honked their car horns and flashed their lights if they scored a Bingo. Drive-in Bingo was such a hit that more sessions were added.

#### Keeping Seniors Engaged and Connected

Despite being closed to the public, the Highland Park Senior Center in Highland Park, Illinois, is offering interactive, virtual programs over Zoom for its members. These programs include a book club, bridge, a current events discussion group, Bingo, knitting, and more. The free programs started in the spring and are still going strong. Some classes are weekly, while others are every two weeks and even monthly. Most of the classes have 10 to 20 participants, which is proving to be a good range of participants for these conversation-based sessions. Many of the programs are informational, although some, like Bingo, are actual games, where the instructor provides a link on the Zoom app and participants all go to the website and play.

#### **Bingo for Robotics**

Robocats is a robotics team from Girard High School in Girard, Ohio, that builds and enters robots in state and national competitions. One of the Robocats' main fundraisers is a Bingo event which takes place annually during an Italian festival in Girard. This year, due to the pandemic, however, the festival was cancelled, leaving the robotics team with a \$20,000 shortfall in funding. Acting quickly, the Robotcats came up with an alternative—an outdoor Bingo event staged in Bruster's Real Ice Cream parking lot, where families and friends enjoyed fun and friendly games of Bingo from the comfort of their vehicles. More than 70 cars filled the parking lot for the event that featured 20 games of socially distanced Bingo.

## Caught in the Act

The Department of Veterans Affairs Office of the Inspector General has been extremely busy. What's astonishing is the criminals who actually think they're going to get away with their crimes.

A gun store thief claimed, in court in front of a judge, that he had been awarded two Purple Hearts. He was trying to get a lower sentence on a couple of other firearms offenses, including stealing 87 guns from a store and then being a felon in possession of guns. Among other things, he claimed Iraq service and said he got the medals for saving another soldier. He showed photos of his (fake) Purple Heart certificates. Nobody was fooled.

Then there was the idiot who defrauded cemetery services customers out of a half million dollars by taking the payments and using them for personal gain and gambling.

Let's not forget the fool who shot up the inside of a VA hospital with a gun he had tucked in his wheelchair. He won't see daylight for a long time.

Sometimes, though, the OIG handles emotionally tough cases, like the VA hospital nursing assistant that murdered seven hospitalized veterans and was planning to kill an eighth by injecting them all with lethal doses of insulin. In one case medical staff discovered the patient's blood sugar level and were able to revive him... until the nursing assistant came back and injected him again, killing him. Nursing assistants are not allowed (or trained to) administer medication.

Multiple law enforcement agencies cooperated, leaving no stone unturned to rein in the killer, conducting 350 interviews, serving 60 subpoenas and so much more. Still, there are many unanswered questions, such as why wasn't the insulin locked up to keep unauthorized people out of it? Why didn't anyone notice a pattern that went on for over a year? But the biggest question might never be answered: Why? Why on earth did she do this?

#### **Hunting a Big Win**

A North Carolina man on the hunt for the final top prize in a scratch-off lottery game said he visited dozens of stores before scratching off the \$5 million winner. Kevin Clark of Candler says he read there was only one top prize remaining in the Mega Cash scratch-off game, so he set off to buy as many of the \$20 tickets as he could locate. "I had a real good feeling it was going to be in the western part of the state," Kevin says. "I went to about 40 different stores and bought every single last Mega Cash ticket I could find." His pricey gamble paid off when he scanned a ticket he purchased from a convenience store in Swannanoa. "I scanned it with my phone and it told me to go see a retailer," he say. "So, I scratched it off and I couldn't believe it! I started shaking. And then I cried." Kevin, who mows grass for a living, took his prize as a \$3 million lump sum, which is just over \$2.1 million after taxes.

## Player Beats the Clock, Barely

Stacey Elmborg of Omaha,
Nebraska, scored a \$128,000
lottery jackpot and almost missed
out on her prize due to the
deadline for buying tickets. She
arrived at a local supermarket just
minutes before the 9 p.m. deadline
to buy her ticket for the Nebraska
Pick 5 drawing. She went to the
customer service counter and
was concerned she was going
to miss the deadline when she
found there was no clerk at the
counter. Luckily, the clerk, who
was helping another customer,

arrived just in time to help Stacey buy her ticket, made up of family birthday numbers. She plans to use her winnings to move into a new residence with her son.

## **Store Clerk Picks A Winner**

A Michigan man said allowing a store clerk to choose his lottery ticket for him paid off when he scored a \$500,000 jackpot. The 73-year-old Dickinson County man, who chose to remain anonymous, wanted to buy a scratch-off lottery ticket at a food store in Marquette, but was struck by indecision. "I had a \$5 bill in my pocket, and I asked the clerk to pick me a winner," the player says. The clerk selected a scratch-off ticket and handed it over to the man. "I scratched the ticket off and got a symbol to win \$500,000!" the winner says. He plans to share some of his winnings with family and invest the rest.

## Waiting for Mom Pays Off

Herbert Scruggs of Virginia was waiting for his mother to finish shopping at a store in Richmond when he decided to pass the time by buying a lotto scratcher. After arriving home, he scratched the ticket and had to hand it over to his mother to confirm what he was seeing. "She got all excited," Herbert recalls. "She said I won!" The ticket was a \$200,000 topprize winner. "It feels surreal," he says of his windfall. "It still hasn't hit me yet."

## **Upcoming National Museum To Honor All Soldiers**

If you or someone you know is a soldier, Army veteran, Army family member or other proud military supporter, you can become a permanent part of history at the National Museum of the United States Army.

An historic project led by the Army Historical Foundation and the U.S. Army, the Museum is going up at Fort Belvoir, Va., just south of Washington, D.C.

"We are proud to build a national museum that will tell the history of the Army—and our nation—through the eyes of American soldiers," said Foundation President U.S. Army Retired Lt. Gen. Roger Schultz. "The timeline for opening the Museum was delayed because of the COVID-19 pandemic, but we promise it will be worth the wait."

To be included in the Museum's story, soldiers and Army veterans can submit their stories of service in the Registry of the American Soldier, which will be one of the largest collections of American Soldier profiles ever assembled. Stories can also be submitted on a veteran's behalf, at no cost. The Foundation currently features the

Registry on its website and the collection will be made available on kiosks in the Museum. Stories can be submitted at www. armyhistory.org/the-registries/.

Members of the Army community can also be a permanent part of the Museum by ordering a customized commemorative brick to be laid on the grounds of the Museum. More than 8,000 bricks have already been installed, honoring soldiers from all 50 states. Among the bricks are those for such well-known Army veterans as Senator Bob Dole and General Eric Shinseki. Individuals and organizations can order bricks at www.armyhistory.org/bricks.



Depending on how closely you want to monitor your mother, and what she's comfortable with as well, there are check-in call services along with some new monitoring technology devices you can turn to for help. Here are several to consider.

#### **Check-In Calls**

If you just want a simple check to make sure your mom is OK every day, consider signing her up with a daily check-in call service program. These are telephone reassurance programs run by police or sheriff's departments in hundreds of counties across the country and are usually provided free of charge.

Here's how they work. A computer automated phone system would call your mom at a designated time each day to check-in. If she answers, the system would assume everything is OK. But if she didn't pick up or if the call goes to voice mail after repeated tries, you (or her other designee) would get a notification call. If you are not reachable, calls are then made to backup people who've also agreed to check on your mom if necessary.

The fallback is if no one can be reached, the police or other emergency services personnel will be dispatched to her home.

To find out if this service is available in your mom's community, call her local police department's nonemergency number. If it's not offered, there are other organizations or companies you can turn to that provide similar services.

One that I love that's completely free to use is Mon Ani (monami.io, 650-267-2474), which offers a volunteer phone bank that provides phone or video calls daily, weekly or anything in between. The volunteer will connect with your mom, provide companionship and make sure everything is OK. And, they'll let you know if they detect a problem.

#### **Monitoring Technology**

Technology also offers a variety of new ways to help you keep an eye on your mom when you can't be there.

One nifty new option is the Electronic Caregiver's (<u>electroniccaregiver.com</u>) "Premier" product, which is a wearable wrist device that provides activity monitoring, a 24/7 emergency help button, medication reminders and a GPS locator so you can determine your mom's whereabouts when she's away from home. It's also linked to a family caregiver app to keep you and other loved ones in the loop. The device is free with a monthly subscription that costs \$40 to \$60 a month, depending on the level of monitoring.

If your mom is primarily homebound, another option to consider is a sensormonitoring system like **Caregiver Smart Solutions** (caregiversmartsolutions.com). This uses small sensors (not cameras) placed in key areas of your mom's home to track her activities-everything from whether she used the coffee pot to how much she's watching TV-and will let you know if something out of the ordinary is happening. For instance, if she went to the bathroom and didn't leave, it could indicate a fall or other emergency.

You can also check up on her patterns anytime you want through the system's website or app. And for additional protection, it offers emergency call buttons that can be placed around the house. Caregiver Smart Solutions starts at \$99 for their activity sensors, plus a \$29 monthly service fee.

### BAKED GRITS AND CHEESE CASSEROLE

1 ½ cups grits 6 cups boiling water 3 teaspoons salt

1 teaspoon paprika
Dash of hot pepper sauce

1 pound sharp cheddar cheese, grated

1 stick butter

Pour the grits into the pot of boiling water, stirring constantly until completely mixed. Cook until thickened. Add the salt, paprika and hot pepper sauce. Mix thoroughly. In a bowl, beat the eggs slightly. Add a small amount of hot grits to the eggs. Stir constantly to prevent coagulation of the eggs. Add remaining grits gradually. Add cheese and butter, mix well. Pour into a buttered 9 x 13-inch casserole dish. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 45 minutes.

#### BAKED CARROTS

4 cups peeled and diced carrots 1/3 cup butter, softened ½ cup white sugar ½ cup brown sugar 1 tablespoon salt ½ teaspoon cinnamon 1/3 cup boiling water

Spread the diced carrots in a casserole dish. In a bowl, cream together the butter, white sugar, brown sugar, salt and cinnamon. Add the water and blend. Pour over the carrots. Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 1 1/2 hours.

## Get a Kick out of Triple Double Bonus Video Poker

by Gayle Mitchell

Triple Double Bonus Video Poker is one of the video poker versions with a real WOW! factor.

The pay-table offers a generous payout of 4,000 coins for four Aces if the fifth or kicker card is a two, three or four.

Further, you are not shortchanged for a Royal Flush as you still receive the same 4,000-coin payout for this top hand. Let's explore further these two options for a top payday.

Quad or four-of-a-kind 2s, 3s and 4s also present some profitable opportunities as seen below. However, there is a penalty in that; three-of-a-kind is reduced five coins to a max-coin return of only 10. Of course, straights and flushes are similarly decreased. I have re-arranged the pay table below moving the straight flush item up to allow readers to view the various top awards for quads in a group for this version.

In this group of quads, you will notice that four 2s, 3s and 4s offer a good payout of 400 coins. Even better, add a fifth card kicker of an ace, two, three or four and you are in for a grand 2,000-coin payout. Half a Royal, in fact.

Additionally, 4 Aces without the required fifth card still puts you in the money with an 800-coin payout.

The table below illustrates the payout for specific winning hands, one-coin return payout and maximum coin return payout.

**Strategy Tips:** Aces with a particular fifth card and as always, a Royal is the goal here. Also, in

an aggressive search for four aces, you should utilize the strategy to hold the ace only in plays where you are dealt other high cards (Jacks+) not suited. Otherwise, if dealt a suited ace and face, then you will hold both.

The reduced pay of 10 coins for 3-of-a-kind does in turn reduce the overall percentage return for this game; however, I find it is difficult, as I sure you will, to pass up the generous payouts at the top to play this exciting VP version.

Good Luck catching Royalty or Royal 4 Aces w/ the right kicker!



### **Poker Talk**



### Give Opponents A Chance to Make a Mistake

By Jonathan Little

Sometimes the best move you can make at the poker table is to give your opponent a chance to make a mistake.

In a \$1,000-buy-in event, blinds were at 150-300 with an ante of 25 when a tight, passive female player with a stack of 18,000 limped in from first position. A loose, aggressive Brazilian player with 7,500 called from third position, as did the player in fourth position.

With 22,000 in chips, I looked down at 9s 9c, which is normally a strong hand. While I could certainly raise both for value and protection, I decided to limp as well. Especially against first-position limpers, I much prefer limping myself, because some amateurs love to limp with premium hands from first position, looking to reraise.

When you limp instead of raise preflop, you'll frequently concede the pot to a bet on most flops. You must be disciplined enough to get away from a marginal postflop holding when it becomes clear that you are drawing nearly dead.

Both of the blinds came along as well. The flop came Qh 10h 9d, giving me bottom set.

The blinds checked to the woman in first position, who bet 500 into a pot of 2,025. The Brazilian player in third position called. The player in fourth position folded. I raised to 1,500.

This raise was meant to charge the draws and ensure that marginal made hands would call and see the turn. A large raise to 5,000, would charge the draws the maximum, but if I got any action, it would usually be from a larger set or a straight.

The blinds folded, and both the female player and the Brazilian player called. The turn was the 2c. My opponents checked, and I bet 3,200 into a pot of 6,525.

To my surprise, both players called again. At this point, I assumed that the female player had a marginal made hand like A-A, K-K or A-Q, and that the Brazilian player had some sort of draw. Interestingly enough, the Brazilian player had only 2,500 left after calling my turn bet. I didn't quite know what to make of his willingness to call off

most of his chips, but this was the type of play you often see in smallbuy-in events.

The river was the Qc, giving me a marginal full house. The female player bet 7,000 into a pot of 16,125, leaving 6,000 in her stack. The Brazilian player folded, confirming he was on a draw.

Against blatantly tight and straightforward players, a case could be made for folding, assuming your opponent would not vastly overvalue trip queens. I wasn't sure this particular opponent would only bet with better hands than my full house, so folding was out of the question.

Next, I had to decide whether she would lead for 7,000 with a queen and then be unable to fold it for 6,000 more if I raised. I was unsure about this. I also thought she'd make this play with any full house, so I could be crushed.


In tournaments, there is a lot of value in not losing a significant pot with less than the nuts, even if you have the best hand more than half of the time when your river raise gets called. There is a huge amount of value in maintaining a playable stack.

I decided to call with what I assumed would be the best hand most of the time. Much to my surprise, my opponent said, "I'm bluffing," and turned up Ks 10d for two pair and a gutshot straight draw.

That was lucky!




