The Relationship Between Old and New

If you look in your Bible between Malachi and Matthew, the division is as clear as it can be. Inserted between the two books you will find a page bearing the title "New Testament" or "New Covenant." Even in the Table of Contents this distinction is prominent. However, for many people, this distinction represented by a tiny page in their Bibles holds little if any meaning in a real way. They are as likely to consider what Moses said to answer a question about what God expects of them as to look to the apostle Paul. In questions of polygamy and marriage, they may turn to Abraham and David as readily as to Jesus and Paul's discussions (Matt. 19: 1-12; Eph. 5:22-33). In some cases, people will pit portions of the Old Covenant against portions of the New Covenant whenever it might bolster their own position. All of this illustrates that people do not understand properly the relationship between the two.

The New Covenant continues the same plot and themes established in the Old Covenant. As the Old Covenant presents the problem of sin, the New Covenant delivers the answer for sin. The Old Covenant ends with prophecies of what lies in the future, and the New Covenant begins with the fulfillment of those prophecies. While the Old Covenant records where Jews and Gentiles were divided, the New Covenant shows how and where they are united. The Old Covenant demonstrates the spiritual history of man and his sinfulness, while the New Covenant shows us the potential of man as seen in the life of Jesus Christ. The Old Covenant introduces the Mosaical Law, but the New Covenant demonstrates the fulfillment of that law (Mt. 5:17; Col. 2:14) and the establishment of the New (Rom. 8: 1-4). The Old Covenant promises something better to come upon the earth, while the New Covenant fulfills that promise and promises something better beyond this earth (1 J n. 2:25). As such, the Old Covenant was part of God's purpose in preparing mankind, but its role was not permanent. The New Covenant, on the other hand, built upon the eternal principles God had established throughout the Old Covenant and provided a new and better Covenant that is designed for the rest of time.

Therefore, we do not appeal to the Old Covenant for authority on what we do to please God today because we have something better. However, that does not mean that the Old Covenant serves no purpose. Throughout the New Testament, the writers refer to incidents and people in the Old Testament for examples. "Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come" (1 Cor. 10: 11). Indeed, a thorough knowledge of the Old Testament is essential to understand in any depth and with any real meaning the message of the New. Therefore, the Old Testament still serves a purpose; it is just not the same purpose it had originally. "For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope" (Rom. 15:4).
