Father Hearn has resumed celebrating weekday Masses in the Chapel at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday and Fridays. All are invited to attend.

In today's Gospel, we hear the Sadducees, a conservative group within Judaism in Jesus' time, testing Jesus with a question about what happens after a person dies. Jesus' answer suggests that life after death will be different from life on earth, and we are reminded of what our faith tells us that when we die our life is changed, but it is not ended. As we proclaim our faith this Sunday in the words of the Apostles' Creed, let us proudly profess our belief in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting, confident that, even after our death, we will continue to share a relationship with our God.



**NOVEMBER 11 - REMEMBRANCE DAY:**

On Friday Canadians pause in silence to remember those who died in war and to pray for the victims of aggression and inhumanity throughout the world. This is a day also to pray for peace, to consider what we are doing as individuals, as a community, and as a nation to bring God's peace into the world. It is a day too for a believing community to rededicate itself by prayer and action to the ideals Jesus gives us in the beatitudes. (*Matthew 5.1-12*).

**The Beatitudes**

The Beatitudes are the teachings of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (*Matthew 5:1-10*). Jesus teaches us that if we live according to the Beatitudes, we will live a happy Christian life. The Beatitudes fulfill God's promises made to Abraham and his descendants and describe the rewards that will be ours as loyal followers of Christ.

- Blessed are the meek**, for they will inherit the land.
- Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness**, for they will be satisfied.
- Blessed are the merciful**, for they will be shown mercy.
- Blessed are the clean in heart**, for they will see God.
- Blessed are the peacemakers**, for they will be called children of God.
- Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness**, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

**NOVEMBER 10 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT LEO THE GREAT, POPE, DOCTOR:** Leo was born to Tuscan parents. His religious beliefs guided his entire life. As a deacon, he worked to bring peace to warring Roman factions who were leaving Gaul vulnerable to barbarian invasion. Leo is well known for his peacekeeping efforts, and especially for his encounter with Attila the Hun, persuading Attila not to plunder Rome. During another attack three years later, Leo was not so successful, though he did manage to save the city from being burnt. Leo worked alongside the people to rebuild the city and its churches. Pope from 440 until his death in 461, Leo is best known for his sermons on faith and charity. Always a strong opponent of heresies, his teaching has had a lasting influence on the life of the Roman Church. He is the first pope whose sermons and letters have been preserved in extensive collections. He was made Doctor of the Church in 1754.

## Report on the Synodal Process



It was with gratitude to Pope Francis that the Diocese of Grand Falls began its Synodal Journey on the Solemnity of our Diocesan Patroness – Mary, the Immaculate Conception. Based on responses heard and recorded, it was decided to create two reports: one to be forwarded to the Atlantic Region and a second to be used at our own diocesan and parish levels. In the coming weeks, in the Sunday bulletin, you will be provided with the second report (condensed version) of the parish responses that were forwarded to the Atlantic Region.

### 1. Sacramental Life, Rituals and Devotions

- Sacramental life is very important.
- Promotion of the importance of the sacraments is required.
- Comfort is found in celebrations like the Easter Vigil.
- Church traditions and culture as well as the use of signs and symbols such as rosary beads is valued.
- Some come to church to receive the sacraments only.
- The Sacrament of Ordination and the need for a non-discriminatory priesthood that permits the ordination of male, female, non-binary, single, married persons was mentioned in almost every session.
- The need for more attention to increasing vocations: priests, deacons, religious was a common thread.
- It was suggested that anyone who wishes should be permitted to receive the Eucharist, not just Catholics. Catholics should be aware of circumstances permitting non-Catholics to receive Eucharist.
