Annual Meeting

Mark your calendar, the Annual Meeting will be held on February 16th. The location of the meeting will be designated in the Annual Meeting Notice scheduled to be mailed on January 26th. The Annual Meeting will include a presentation of the Community budget and financial reports. The Annual Meeting will include the election of three Board of Directors since those terms are expiring. Nominates who are interested in serving will be included in the Annual Meeting notice. While the deadline for Board of Director nominations has passed, nominations will be accepted from the floor at the Annual Meeting.

Community Center Improvements

The Board of Directors has retained the landscape architecture firm - M2L Associates to assist with the planning of the Community Center Improvements. The program is based on the input received from Community Center committee. Among the improvements being investigated are a new outdoor event pavilion, more playfields, walking paths with exercise and new tennis courts with pickleball options, volleyball court or soccer/t-ball field.

We will have more information including a presentation of the designs by M2L Associates at the Annual Meeting for discussion, suggestions, and questions. Concept illustrations on following page.

Swim Team Activities: The The Villager Piranhas swim team is gearing up for its 2023 season. We want to thank the community for all its support in the past years. A special thank you to Ben Smith for making our new lane rope reel and Michael Moberly for the amazing photographs of the team. Our team has been around since the 70s and we are looking forward to many more seasons. Swim team is a great way to become strong swimmers, leading to increased safety around water. It also teaches children about being in a team and leadership.

Pool: The Country Village Pool renovations (replastering) began on January 16th. This will possibly be loud at times while the contractor is removing the existing plaster. There will also be limited parking available in the parking lot due to a dumpster. The pool including the kiddie pool will be closed during this time. The demo process should only take approximately one week. In the following weeks, they will be installing new plaster, tile and 5 tiled lane lines courtesy of the Villager Piranhas swim team. We expect the work to be completed by the end of February. The pool should tentatively be back to normal operating condition by March 1st.



While the work is in progress CV residents can also swim throughout the year at the Heathlake pool through our joint use agreement. Architectural Control Committee: Remember to always obtain ACC approval before making changes to the exterior of your home, including any exterior painting, roofing, fence, or driveway replacement. The instructions and Exterior Modification Request application can be found on the Crest web site noted above. We currently have four committee members and would like to add additional member. If you are interested, please contact any Director for assistance.

Deed Restrictions: Please remember we are a Deed Restricted community. The restrictions are posted on our web site.

Trash & Recycling Services: Trash service is Monday and Thursday. Recycling service is Wednesday.

"Backdoor" trash pickup is provided for standard residential trash and grass clippings, which means trash can(s) or bags can be placed near the back or gate but outside of any fenced area. A maximum of 6 bags not exceeding 40 pounds per bag per pickup.

Tree trimmings and branches, cut in length not to exceed four (4) feet, securely tied in bundles weighting less than 40 pounds, heavy trash and recycling must be placed curb side.

Generally, paper, cardboard, plastic, and metal are accepted for recycling. Glass is not currently accepted.

Holiday Collection days falling on Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years will occur the following day and service for the subsequent day in the same week will also be completed one day later. Collection days falling on Good Friday, Memorial Day, July 4th and Labor Day will continue as normal.

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

Building a deck? Planting a tree? 811 is the new number you should call before you begin any digging project.

A federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811 was created to help protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects. People digging often make risky assumptions about whether or not they should get their utility lines marked due to concerns about project delays, costs and previous calls about other projects. These assumptions can be life-threatening.

Make a call for every digging job – even small projects like planting trees or shrubs. If you hit an underground utility line while digging, you can harm yourself or those around you, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially be responsible for fines and repair costs.

A recent study revealed that nearly half of homeowners who plan to dig this year won't call 811 to learn the approximate locations of buried gas, electric, communications, water and sewer lines before digging, putting their safety and the safety of others at risk. According to data collected by CGA, when an individual makes a call to 811 before digging, damage occurs less than 1 percent of the time.

If you are planning on traveling this season and would like to have the Constable put a vacation watch on your house, please go to the Precinct 5 constable website (**www.Constablepct5.com**) and download the form.

While you are on the website you can look over the other programs that the Constable offers. I took the "Citizens Police Academy". It was extremely informative and enjoyable. Sadly, crime continues and our lawn and garden contractors and homeowners are easy prey for theft of equipment. Please remind them to watch their equipment.

During the year we have many residents enjoying the outdoors and walking the streets of CV, please be observant of your surroundings...if something does not appear right, please call the Constable. The Constable can typically respond in 5-10 minutes, so please call. If you are the victim of a crime, call the Constables, they will respond faster and inform the neighborhood of the crime in a timely manner. HPD does not send out crime alerts, so if you are the victim and HPD responds the only way we would know about it would be for the victim to pass along the information.
