Healing the Healer and the Adjusting Child - Dr. Aja King

Date: Wednesday, August 24, 2022

Time: 9:00 a.m. - Noon Location: Virtual

Description: Being a teaching professional is entrenched in healing qualities which impacts the lives of children. While being a healer may be rewarding, it's also stressful in the best of times. Right now, we are living through the stress. Our mission to heal has been covered with uncertainty as we step up for children who are experiencing so many layers of complex trauma. This session will offer concrete tips on how to heal yourself on various cultural spectrums as you care for children adjusting to their new educational norms.

Dakota Sacred Sites Tour - Dr. Darlene St. Clair

Date: Wednesday, October 5, 2022

Location: Bus Tour (Depart from NWSISD District Office), and TBD lunch on your own

Description: We are living, learning, and working in a particular place with a long, fascinating, troubling, and frequently unknown story. One goal for this tour is that participants begin to experience the place we live in as Mnisota Makoce, the Dakota homelands. We will be visiting several Dakota sacred sites located in an area that would later be called the Twin Cities. How has colonization impacted Dakota use and access to these places? How have Dakota people asserted a continuing relationship with these places? What happens when this history is unknown by Minnesotans. How can educators work to address this gap in knowledge and understanding? This tour will provide participants with a more nuanced and detailed understanding of the place we call home.

The Inner Workings of Student Relationships while Dealing with Race and Culture - Willie Adams and Kendrick Walton

Date: Wednesday, November 2, 2022 **Location:** NWSISD District Office

Description: Participants will be able to learn and have conversations about the importance of student relationships in education. Participants will also learn and have conversations about how race and culture impact relationships that are necessary for so many students to succeed in education.

How Society Shapes Community, Race, and Culture - Dr. Rassheedah Watts

Date: Wednesday, December 7, 2022

Location: Virtual

Description: Dr. Watts will walk participants through how society helps shape how we see and experience community, race and culture. Participants will be guided through conversations and activities that allow participants to evaluate how the society they have been a part of has shaped their views. This IDP is the first part of a larger deep-dive on how society shapes our views and how to work with-in those communities to better shape our profession. The deep-dive will be a 2-part evening series in January.

DACA Student Experiences

Description: Participants will learn what the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) is and isn't while hearing experiences from local DACA students. This will be an inside look at the DACA experience and how local students are living within the residency program while trying to succeed in education.

TransAtlantic Slave Trade (Mama - African Holocaust) - Dr. Karen McKinneuy

Date: Wednesday, June 21, 2023

Location: TBD

Description: Maafa, the Swahili word for "great disaster" or "great tragedy," is a term used to refer to the centuries-long enslavement and murder of millions of Africans by white Europeans, North Americans, and others—and the lasting impacts on African Peoples and the descendants of those who were enslaved. Participants will be guided through a moment in an enslavement simulation by Dr. McKinney. Participants will then have a chance to have a conversation about what they saw, felt and experienced during the simulation.
