Choose Life - Choose Good

ON THE WORD

REFLECTIONS In the first reading from the book of Sirach we are told: "before each person are life and death, good and evil and whichever one chooses, that shall be given." Doesn't this seem like the ultimate no-brainer? Who wouldn't choose life and good? If it's that easy, why do we struggle with so many of our decisions in life? I think it's because very few, if any of the situations we find ourselves in are that black and white.

I think this is what Jesus is driving at in today's gospel. He is trying to tell his disciples that things may not be as simple as they seem on the surface. From the point of view of the disciples, and the Pharisees (church of the day) for that matter, the law was in place and seemed pretty straight forward. Don't break any of the commandments: don't teach anyone to break the commandments and you should be good. Then comes the sermon on the mount and Jesus calls us to something more. He invites us to go beyond simply obeying the law to something deeper. For example, if the only reason you obey the law is to avoid punishment then you are missing out on the deeper meaning. Respect and love for your neighbor.

As a self professed Christian living in today's world I need to assess daily whether I am just doing the bare minimum in my observance of God's law or going the extra mile that Jesus is calling me to. While I have not physically murdered anyone, have I taken care to preserve their dignity as a person and worked diligently to keep their reputation intact. I truly believe in the saying: "give people a reputation they will want to live up to". We are called to welcome the stranger; to comfort widows and orphans. You know, there is much talk these days on both sides of the border about the acceptance of refugees and screening people to make sure they fit in our society. Do I welcome the stranger whole heartedly and make them feel at home or am I just ok that they are here as long as I don't have to deal with them. Huge difference between tolerance and acceptance.

Choosing life and good is the right way to go but it's anything but easy. If it was easy then everyone would do it. I heard it said in a homily that when trying to make a difficult decision, your guiding principle should always be: what requires the most love? If we do the thing that requires the most love from us then I think we're moving in the right direction. Simply following the letter of the law doesn't require much love on my part. On the other hand, seeking the deeper truth in the spirit of the law requires a lot. So, when asked if I choose life over death and good over evil, I say: YES. Not: Yes, but....the but comes from the evil one.
