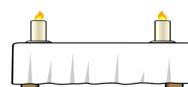

4th Week of Lent

We are over half way to Easter. Have you checked in recently on where you are at with your Lenten observances? We are nearing Holy Week beginning March 28th on Palm Sunday, how will you prepare for this week as a family?

St Patrick's Day

Wednesday March 17th is the feast of St Patrick. The patron saint of Ireland, Patrick was born in Roman Britain. Kidnapped at age 16 by Irish raiders and sold into slavery in Ireland, his time spent in captivity transformed him spiritually. He was a lonely shepherd for six years before escaping and returning home. After returning home, his dream of converting the Irish from pagan belief propelled him to priestly studies. In about 432, Pope Celestine I consecrated him as a bishop and sent him to Ireland. For nearly 30 years, he preached tirelessly and made countless converts. Stories that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Trinity and drove snakes from the island are unconfirmed legend.

You can celebrate the feast as a family by learning about St. Patrick's story of the shamrock. The legend that St Patrick drove snakes from Ireland is symbolic for his work of driving out the evils of paganism from Ireland. For fun, try playing the game Chutes & Ladders (also called Snakes & Ladders). As a family discuss how the snakes symbolize sin and falling away from God, while the ladders represent faith in God. St. Patrick, pray for us!

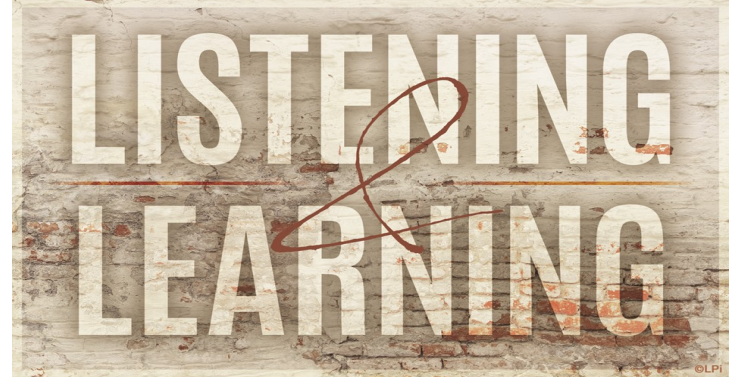
