



I got to ride the loop two times, once on Saturday and again at dawn Sunday morning. The purpose of my Sunday ride was to make sure everything was OK with the course. The arrows were all still up and everything was OK with the course. Well, I had



ridden 3 miles when I found someone camped right on the trail. I woke them up and told them 200 of my closest friends were going to come right through their campsite in 45 minutes. Luckily, they got the heck out of Dodge without taking any arrows down.

Then, on the trail leading to Camp Ridge Campground, there was this truck off the side of the trail. The trail just dropped off and this truck was way down there. I don't know how they got it out of there, but the riders said they got it out between the first and second loops!

We tried another new thing this year, an ATV class. They were to start at the back of all the motorcycles. In fact, twenty minutes behind the last sweep riders for the women and kids. It did-

n't work—they caught the women and kids in the first three miles. I don't think we'll be able to do that again.

It seemed like no time before the first riders were finishing and the scoring began. You see, the check crews recorded the start times and finish times on the mylars. The extra short course riders had three special tests, the short course riders had six special tests and long course had nine. You must subtract the start time from


Steve Levian won the event. If you look at the results on the Website, Steve won every special test as well.

The first race of the 2001-2002 Hillbilly Grand Prix series was held on November 4th at Lu's Place about five miles north of Bolivar on Highway 13. Perfect conditions greeted 170 racers (120 on bikes and 50 on ATVs).

Spud and crew laid out a 4.3 mile trail. If you haven't been to Lu's place, there are a few rocks. Recent

rains made them slick rocks. There were a few soft spots that rutted up a little bit, but not too bad. The course was rideable by all.

Grand Prix puts the bikes out there for 45 minutes, then the ATVs go for 45 minutes. Then it's repeated,

Here's the riders meeting. Just like any other riders meeting except, that's Roger Decoster!


